No. 15 Huskers Head to Missouri this Weekend

The Nebraska baseball team looks to build on the momentum of Tuesday's win over No. 10 Wichita State this weekend, as the Huskers travel to Missouri for a three-game series with the Tigers. All three games will be carried on the Pinnacle Sports Network with Gary Sharp calling all of the action, although Saturday's game will be joined in progress following the Red/White Spring Game.

The Huskers, who are ranked between 15th (Sports Weekly/ESPN) and 19th (Baseball America) in this week's polls, snapped a two-game losing streak in a 7-4 win over the Shockers in Lincoln on the strength of Alex Gordon's four-RBI effort. NU picked up its first win over the Shockers since 2001.

At 25-7 on the year, NU now begins a stretch with six of the next seven games on the road, including trips to Missouri and No. 1 Texas next weekend. NU is in third place in the Big 12 with a 6-3 mark, trailing Oklahoma (10-2) and Texas (9-2) in the league race after dropping 2-of-3 against Texas Tech last weekend. The series win by the Red Raiders snapped a streak of 10 straight Big 12 series wins dating back to last March.

The Tigers are 22-12-2 after downing Southwest Missouri State, 5-4, in 10 innings Wednesday evening in Springfield. In league play, Missouri enters the weekend tied with Kansas and Kansas State for eighth place with a 2-7 mark after being swept by Oklahoma last weekend. MU has dropped all three of its league series, picking up wins against Kansas State and Baylor in Big 12 play.

The Tigers lead the all-time series, 127-94, but Nebraska took the season series in 2003 with a pair of come-from-behind wins, overcoming an 8-1 deficit in one game to win 11-9 in 10 innings and scoring three times in the bottom of the ninth to win 7-6 in the finale. In fact, all three wins last season came in the team's final at-bat. In the team's last matchup in Columbia in 2002, the Tigers used a pair of late comebacks to erase Husker leads and take the series 2-1.

Following this weekend's series with MU, the Huskers will host Creighton on Tuesday, April 20th at 6:35 p.m. Prior to the game, each of Nebraska's

winter sport NCAA Champions will be honored in pre-game ceremonies. NU won the first matchup, 7-3 in Omaha last month, and has won six straight against the Bluejays.

Leading Off

- The Huskers have been perched in the national polls for the past 77 weeks, dating back to April of 2000. To put that in perspective, the only current Husker to have been on a team that was unranked in his career is fifth-year senior Justin Pekarek, who was redshirting in 2000.

- The Huskers rank third nationally in fielding percentage in the first NCAA ranking released Tuesday. The Huskers' .977 fielding percentage leads the Big 12 and is on pace to break the school record of .971 set in 1994 and 1995. The Huskers are a perfect 14-0 this season when they play errorless baseball and have a pair of stretches of at least 45 innings without an error, including a stretch of 63.1 innings - the longest stretch in at least 20 years - last month.

- First baseman Curtis Ledbetter has been on a tear since returning to the lineup after a shoulder injury. The first baseman from Lawrence, Kan., is hitting .364 with four homers and 16 RBIs over his last 10 games, raising his season average to .295. He has 33 RBIs, a total that is second only to Alex Gordon.

- Nebraska, which is second in the Big 12 and 17th nationally in team ERA (3.27 as of 4/12), is the only Big 12 program and one of only nine teams nationally to be ranked in the top-20 nationally in both pitching and defense, joining Long Beach State, Rice, North Carolina State, Oral Roberts, East Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia and Mississippi.

In fact, eight of the nine teams listed (all but North Carolina State) are ranked in the top-25 in this week's Baseball America poll, while the Wolfpack are ranked in two of the other three college baseball polls this week.

- Nebraska's 25-7 mark through 32 games is the Huskers' best mark since 1987 (26-6 after 32 games). The 2001 CWS squad also went 25-7 in its first 32 contests.



Head Coach Mike Anderson

Northern Colorado, 1990
(72-25 (.742) - Second Season)

Mike Anderson is in his second season as Nebraska's head baseball coach, becoming the 23rd head coach in the program's history on June 21, 2002. Anderson has been associated with the NU program for the last decade, serving as an assistant from the fall of 1994 until his promotion to head coach in 2002.

Since joining the Nebraska staff in the fall of 1994, he has coached a total of 15 first-team all-conference honorees, while 19 of his former players have signed professional contracts. His most famous protegee is current Anaheim Angel All-Star Darin Erstad, who earned first-team All-America honors in 1995, when he was the first overall selection in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Seven Huskers have been tabbed first-team All-Americans under Anderson's tutelage, while four players – Erstad (1995), Harvey (1999), Dan Johnson (2001) and Jed Morris (2002) – have been finalists for various national player-of-the-year awards.

In 2003, Anderson guided Nebraska to a 47-18 record. After being picked fourth in the preseason by the league coaches, the Huskers won the Big 12 regular-season title with a 20-7 record, clinching the title on the final day of the season. He became the second first-year Husker coach to lead NU to a conference title and the first since 1929.

The Huskers led the Big 12 in hitting in each of Anderson's final four seasons as an assistant coach, including a .338 team average – the second highest in school history – in 1999. The Huskers led the Big 12 in seven offensive categories in 2002, including batting average (.315), hits (753), runs scored (543), doubles (154), RBIs (491), sacrifice hits (49) and sacrifice flies (46). In 2001, Anderson coached a Husker offense that ranked in the top-10 nationally in both team average (.334) and runs per game (9.20), while also finishing second nationally in total hits (787) and runs scored (607).

As the outfielders coach, Anderson has coached three All-Americans and seven all-conference selections, including Jeff Leise, who was a first-team All-American in 2002, while leading the Huskers to their second straight College World Series appearance.

Anderson's commitment to his student-athletes also extends to the classroom. Over the past nine years, the Huskers have placed 40 players on the first-team all-conference squad. Nebraska has had eight CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, including two in each of the past three seasons and 11 first-team academic all-district selections in the past seven seasons.

Before arriving in Lincoln in the fall of 1994, Anderson was the top assistant coach at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colo. He joined the Bears' staff after four years as a head coach with the Northern Colorado Lab School. From 1983 through 1986, Anderson was an outfielder at Northern Colorado for College Hall of Fame Coach Tom Petroff. Anderson was an eighth-round pick by the California Angels, spending four seasons with the Angels organization.

Anderson earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Northern Colorado in 1990. Anderson graduated from Eaton High School in Eaton, Colo., where he was a first-team All-Colorado shortstop for Coach Jim Danley.



Zach Kroenke (pronounced KRON-neck-ee) • So. • LHP • 6-3 • 210 • Omaha, Neb.

2004: Kroenke seeks his team-leading seventh win of the season in Friday's series opener...has made eight starts, going 6-0 with a 1.94 ERA, while striking out 52 in 55.2 innings of work...averages nearly a strikeout per inning and ranks among the Big 12 leaders in ERA (fourth), opponent batting average (.201, fourth) and strikeouts (10th)...is even better in league play, going 3-0 with a 1.17 ERA, while holding opponents to a .169 average, as he is second in the Big 12 in both ERA in opponent average...has pitched at least five innings in all eight starts and is 4-0 with a 1.22 ERA over his last five starts, covering 37 innings...turned in a strong eight inning effort against Texas Tech last Friday, scattering seven hits and allowing one run in a 3-1 victory...fanned nine and held the Red Raiders scoreless over his last eight innings of work...earned Big 12 honors against Kansas State, allowing one hit in a complete-game win over the Wildcats (4/2)...struck out seven and allowed one runner in scoring position as he faced one batter over the minimum...tossed the first individual one-hitter since Aaron Marsden tossed a one-hitter vs. Texas A&M in 2002...was solid against KU, holding the Jayhawks, who led the Big 12 in hitting with a .346 average, to five hits over six-plus innings in a 3-2 win (3/26)...was dominant against Boston College, allowing one run in a season-high 7.1 innings of work (3/19)...struck out eight and allowed one hit over the first 6.1 innings...turned in a strong performance against San Diego (3/12), allowing one run on six hits and taking a shutout into the seventh...allowed three runs on five hits in 5.1 innings in a no-decision against No. 22 Florida State (3/5)...scattered five hits and allowed four runs in seven-plus innings against Northwestern State on Feb. 27...struck out a career-high 11 Wildcats, including six straight, in 6.1 innings of work against Northwestern in the season opener (2/20). **2003 Highlights:** Was one of the Big 12's top freshman hurlers, going 6-2 with a 2.72 ERA in 59.2 innings...enjoyed nearly a 2-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio (35-to-19) while holding opponents to a .239 batting average... allowed three runs or less in 14 of his 15 appearances and combined on a pair of shutouts (Cal Poly and at Kansas)...shared Big 12 Pitcher-of-the-Week honors, going 2-0 in 11.2 innings in wins over Cal Poly and Oklahoma...tossed a complete-game six-hitter against Eastern Michigan in the 2003 NCAA Lincoln Regional...suffered losses against eventual CWS champion Rice (ranked No. 1 at the time) and CWS qualifier Texas (at Omaha's Rosenblatt Stadium)...went 1-0 with a 4.26 ERA in two appearances, earning the start against Baylor in the Big 12 Tournament and against Eastern Michigan in an NCAA elimination game. **Prior:** Ranked among the top 200 players in the nation according to Team One Baseball, Kroenke pitched for Northwest High School in Omaha...earned first-team All-Nebraska honors from the Lincoln Journal Star, going 4-5 with a 3.42 ERA, while leading the state with 90 strikeouts in 53 innings.

Missouri 4, Nebraska 3 - Missouri stunned a Hawks Field crowd of 5,911, scoring three runs in the top of the ninth to pull out a 4-3 victory. Trailing 3-1 and down to their final out, the Tigers strung together four straight hits off Tim Schoeninger to pull out the victory. MU's comeback spoiled an outstanding performance by Aaron Marsden, who struck out a career-high 11 batters in seven scoreless innings, but did not factor in the decision. NU jumped to a 3-0 lead, scoring three runs in the second on a solo homer by Curtis Ledbetter and a two-run shot by Matt Wells, his first of the year.

Nebraska 11, Missouri 9 - 10 inn. - For the second straight game, a record crowd was treated to a thrilling finish, as the Huskers rallied from seven runs down for an improbable 11-9 victory. Trailing 8-1, Matt Hopper got the comeback started with a grand slam in the seventh before NU scored two more in the eighth to close to within 8-7. Freshman Alex Gordon, who tied a career high with three hits, sent the game into extra innings with a solo homer in the ninth, before Hopper, who drove in a career-high seven runs, crushed a three-run homer in the 10th for the game winner. Jason Burch earned the win in relief with two innings of work out of the bullpen.

Nebraska 7, Missouri 6 - Brandon Fusilier's RBI double with two outs in the bottom of the ninth gave the Huskers their second walk-off win in as many days, as NU won the series with a 7-6 victory. The Huskers scored three times in the ninth, giving Tim Schoeninger the win out of the bullpen. Jeff Leise belted a three-run homer while scoring twice, while Curtis Ledbetter and Chad Steele had two hits apiece in the win, marking the Huskers' first series win over Missouri in Lincoln since 1997.

2004: Left-hander Justin Pekarek looks for his first Big 12 win, as he takes the hill on Saturday...fifth-year senior who is 4-1 with a 4.28 ERA in nine outings, including eight starts...has a 7-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio, walking only six hitters in 40 innings of work...has already topped his entire career totals in wins, innings pitched and strikeouts, as he is fully recovered after two years of elbow injuries...is 3-1 with a 2.10 ERA since moving back into a starting role on March 17...has an incredible 28-to-2 strikeout-to-walk ratio and is holding foes to a .206 average...suffered the loss in Sunday's series finale, allowing five unearned runs in a 10-3 setback to Texas Tech...received a no-decision against KSU, allowing three runs on six hits in 4.2 innings (4/4)...turned in the finest outing of his career against Wisconsin-Milwaukee, tossing six innings of no-hit ball in NU's 10-0 win (3/30)...struck out a career-high seven Panthers and retired the last 16 batters he faced...earned the win at Creighton, fanning six in a career-best 6.1 innings of work in NU's 7-3 win (3/23)...retired 12 straight Bluejays at one point, while setting personal bests in innings and matching his strikeout high as a Husker...scattered three hits over five scoreless innings against Western Illinois (3/17), striking out four in the Huskers' 8-0 win...came out of the bullpen against UCLA, tossing two scoreless innings in a 4-2 loss to the Bruins (3/13)...struck out a career-high six Mountaineers against West Virginia on March 7, but allowed four runs on eight hits in just 3.1 innings...turned in one of the best outings of his career against No. 15 North Carolina on Feb. 29...earned the win against the Tar Heels, allowing four runs on six hits in 5.1 innings of work...retired 14 of 15 Tar Heels at one point, including 11 straight entering the sixth inning...allowed five runs on six hits in 3.1 innings at New Mexico (2/21) before leaving with a 6-5 lead...chosen one of three captains by a vote of his teammates after fall drills...enjoyed a breakthrough summer pitching for the Santa Barbara Foresters, compiling a 5-2 mark and a 1.41 ERA in leading the Foresters to a 51-10-1 record and an appearance in the finals of the NBC World Series. **2003 Highlights:** Went 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA in 17 innings of work...earned his first career win against Western Illinois on April 2, allowing three runs in five innings...tossed a complete-game (6 IP because of rain) win against South Dakota, striking out five and allowing one run...missed all of 2002 season after elbow surgery. **2001 Highlights:** Went 0-1 with a save and a 3.88 ERA in three outings, holding opponents to a .125 average...earned a save in three innings of no-hit ball against Lamar...missed over three months with an elbow injury before taking the loss against Tulane in the CWS, allowing three runs in a 6-5 loss to the Green Wave. **2000 Highlights:** Redshirted.

2004: Fourth-year junior who makes his first career Big 12 start against Missouri on Sunday...has appeared in a team-high 12 games, going 1-1 with a 2.29 ERA in 19.2 innings of work...rebounded from Tommy John surgery in March of 2003 to become a major contributor for the Husker staff...has a better than 4-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio and is holding opponents to a .190 average...pitched two innings of shutout ball against No. 10 Wichita State Tuesday evening...pitched well in taking the loss against Texas Tech, allowing two runs on four hits, but matching his career high with four strikeouts over a career-long four innings in a 10-7 loss (4/10)...allowed one run in two innings of relief in the finale at Kansas State (4/2), snapping a streak of five straight scoreless appearances...fanned a pair of Jayhawks in 1.2 innings of shutout relief vs. Kansas (3/28)...picked up the save against Northwestern State throwing two innings of no-hit ball to preserve a Husker win (2/27)...threw a then career-high 2.2 innings against Northwestern in the season opener on Feb. 20, less than a year removed from Tommy John surgery. **2003 Highlights:** Made two appearances before undergoing Tommy John surgery in March...allowed one hit and struck out seven of the 12 hitters he faced in appearances vs. Texas-Pan American and Louisiana Tech...struck out four in two perfect innings vs. Texas-Pan American...allowed one hit in 1.1 shutout innings against Louisiana Tech. **2002 Highlights:** Went 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA in six appearances before missing half the season with an elbow injury...earned his first collegiate win, tossing two innings in a pre-determined start against Nebraska-Kearney in the first game ever at Hawks Field. **2001 Highlights:** Did not have a decision in his four appearances in helping NU to 50 wins and a College World Series appearance...allowed one run in 1.1 innings of relief against Rutgers in the NCAA regional, striking out two in NU's 14-10 come-from-behind win. **Prior:** Went 8-4 with a 1.50 ERA in 84 innings of American Legion baseball (Yutan does not have a high school program), averaging 12 strikeouts per appearance...was drafted in the 41st round by the Kansas City Royals in the 2000 Major League Baseball First-Year Player draft...younger brother Cory is a 6-4, 320-pound reserve offensive lineman for Coach Bill Callahan and the Husker football team.

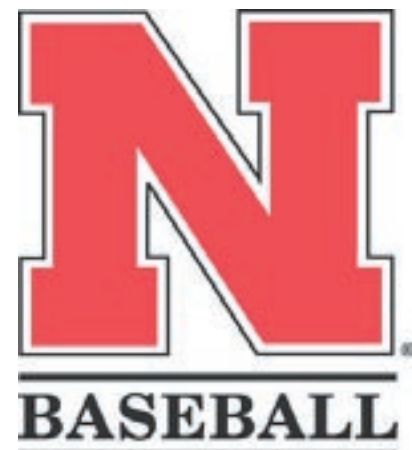

Welcome to Hawks Field at Haymarket Park

The 2002 season marked the debut of the Huskers' new home – Hawks Field at Haymarket Park. The field is named in memory of Myrna Hawks, as the Hawks family was one of the major benefactors in the Haymarket Park project.

In March of 2000, Howard and Myrna Hawks guaranteed the unfunded portion of UNL's \$10.6 million commitment to the baseball/softball complex, which enabled the University to move forward in a joint venture with the City of Lincoln and NEBCO, Inc., the owners of the Lincoln Saltdogs in the Northern League. The University retained the right to name the field and on Feb. 23, 2002, the University of Nebraska Board of Regents approved the name of Hawks Field. It was formally dedicated in pregame ceremonies against Kansas on April 28, 2002. The ballpark includes 4,500 chair-back seats, 16 suites, a Diamond View Lounge and a Sub-Air system that allows the field to grow grass nearly year-round. The park is one of only three fields in the country that uses this state-of-the-art heating system (Invesco Field at Mile High and Safeco Field are the others). Other highlights of the complex include a 1,400-square foot clubhouse for the Husker baseball program, a video board/scoreboard in right center field, the Buck Beltzer Playground for kids down the right field line and numerous restrooms and concession stands.

Hawks Field, as well as the adjacent Bowlin Stadium – the 2,500-seat softball stadium which opened in the fall of 2001 – are both located inside Haymarket Park, a 32-acre complex that includes both stadiums as well as the plaza area and 2,000 parking stalls. The 2002 season marked the first time since World War II that the Huskers did not play at the former sight of Buck Beltzer Stadium on the Nebraska campus.

Husker Baseball Notes vs. Missouri

Scouting Missouri

The Tigers (22-12-1) enter the weekend with some momentum after snapping a six-game losing streak with a 5-4, 10-inning win over SMS on Wednesday.

MU returned 14 letterwinners, including seven everyday starters from a team that won 36 games and reached its first regional since 1996. The Tigers jumped out of the gate with a 12-2 mark, including a pair of wins over NCAA Regional qualifier Coastal Carolina and a victory over Washington before cooling off in recent weeks. Under long-time Head Coach Tim Jamieson (308-228-1 in 10 years at Missouri), the Tigers' strength is on the mound where they are third in the league with a 3.38 team ERA and are walking a league-low 2.44 batters every nine innings. Danny Hill is 3-2 with a 4.06 ERA in nine starts, while Sunday starter Garrett Broshuis is 6-0 with a 2.65 ERA in nine starts. Mark Alexander leads the MU bullpen with five saves and a 1.86 ERA in 16 appearances.

Offensively, the Tigers have three starters batting over .300 and are led by first baseman Cody Ehlers, who is hitting .374 with team highs in homers (11) and RBIs (43).

Missouri leads the all-time series 127-94 in a rivalry that dates back to 1901. NU won 2-of-3 meetings last spring in Lincoln, as the home team has won the past two meetings. From 1999 to 2001, the road team won the regular-season matchup, with NU winning in 2000 while the Tigers won 2-of-3 at Buck Beltzer Stadium in 1999 and 2001.

Last Time Out

Nebraska used a strong performance from third baseman Alex Gordon, who homered and drove in four RBIs in the Huskers' 7-4 win over No. 10 Wichita State on Saturday. The Huskers closed a 20-game stretch with a 17-3 mark, including a 13-3 mark at Hawks Field.

Tuesday (Nebraska 7, Wichita State 4) – Alex Gordon went 3-for-4 and drove in four RBIs, as No. 15 Nebraska snapped a two-game losing streak with a 7-4 victory over No. 10 Wichita State Tuesday evening. The sophomore third baseman jump started Nebraska's offense with his 12th homer of the season, a two-run shot in the first, before adding a two-run double in the Huskers' three-run third, as Nebraska (25-7) posted its 14th straight win over a top-10 team in Lincoln dating back to 1998. The Huskers used homers by Gordon and

Curtis Ledbetter, who added a two-run shot in the eighth, to pick up their first win over Wichita State since the 2001 season. Quinton Robertson (4-4) earned the win, scattering eight hits over 5.2 innings of work for his third straight victory, while three relievers held WSU to one run over the final 3.1 innings.

Gordon Stacks Up at Third

One of the reasons for the Huskers' strong first half start has been the play of third baseman Alex Gordon. The sophomore from Lincoln has been a steady force in the middle of the Husker lineup, leading the Big Red in nearly every offensive category. Gordon, who was named to the Golden Spikes Watch List last week, also paces NU in multi-hit games (14) and multi-RBI efforts (14) and has been walked a team-best 25 times. He also tied Curtis Ledbetter for the team lead with seven game-winning RBIs in 2004.

Gordon Honored Twice

Gordon was named to Baseball America's mid-season All-America team last Friday. The Lincoln native was one of 17 sophomores chosen for the team, which includes one starter at each position, one utility player and six pitchers (five starters and a reliever). Baseball America lists a team for each of the four classes.

He was also honored last Wednesday, as one of 30 players selected to the Golden Spikes Watch List. The Golden Spikes Award has been presented annually by USA Baseball since 1978 to the player who exhibits exceptional athletic ability and exemplary sportsmanship. Gordon is one of four Big 12 players on the 30-player watch list, joining Texas' pitching duo of J.P. Howell and Huston Street and Oklahoma State catcher Jason Jaramillo.

Grose Named to Johnny Bench Watch List

John Grose has been named to the Johnny Bench Watch List. The senior from Henderson, Nev., is a three-year starter for the Huskers and a career .302 hitter. Grose has thrown out nearly 40 percent of would-be base stealers this spring, as Nebraska leads the Big 12, allowing only 19 stolen bases through 32 games. Grose is one of 45 candidates on the initial Watch List. The list will be trimmed to 10 semifinalists on May 10, with the winner being named in early June.

Huskers Display Fine Pensmanship

One strength of the Husker pitching staff has been the performances of the NU relievers who are a combined 6-2 with a 2.95 ERA. The Husker bullpen has converted nine out of 10 save

opportunities, including a team-high four by Mike Sillman. Six pitchers have at least one save, as the staff has allowed just 18 of 74 inherited runners (23 percent) to score.

Stingy Becker Cuts Out Interitance

Junior left-hander Jeremy Becker has made a name for himself as one of the Big 12's situational relievers. While he does not have a save, the 5-11, 215-pounder from Scottsbluff has played a major role in the Huskers' success this spring. While Becker has a 1.04 ERA in 12 appearances and is holding hitters to a .138 average, the most significant number that relates to Becker is zero - the number of inherited runners he has allowed to score in 2004. Becker is a perfect 16-of-16 in keeping inherited runners from scoring, including six situations with two or more runners on base. In fact, he has not allowed an inherited runner to score since April 20, 2003, a total of 24 runners over his last 20 appearances.

Against Kansas State on April 3, Becker entered the game in the sixth inning with NU clinging to a 3-0 lead and KSU loading the bases with no outs. Becker came out of the bullpen to fan both batters he faced. In Tuesday's win against Wichita State, Becker faced a bases-loaded situation, but got out of the jam to preserve the Husker lead.

Pitchers Set Big 12 Shutout Streak Mark

Earlier this month, the Nebraska pitching staff established a record with 43.1 scoreless innings. The record, which included 42 complete innings and parts of two others, broke the Big 12 record of 41 set by Texas in 2002.

In all, the Husker pitchers tossed a pair of one-hitters, a three-hitter and a five-hitter before Kansas State scored a run in the fourth inning of NU's win on April 4, marking the first run scored by a Husker opponent since March 28. Oklahoma held the Big Eight record with 31 straight scoreless innings in 1971, while Arizona State holds the NCAA mark with 64 straight scoreless innings back in 1972.

Ouch!

Husker hitters have been hit at an alarming rate over the first half of the season. Nebraska hitters have been plunked 67 times, including 16 games of three or more. The Huskers have been hit 42 times over the last 17 games, including a season-high six times against UW-Milwaukee on March 30. Colin Shockey leads the Huskers with 14 HBPs, while Daniel Bruce has been hit 12 times, increasing his school record to 54 in 149 career games. At the current rate, NU's projected 56-game regular-season total of 121 would set a Big 12 record and threaten the NCAA record of 125 set by Nevada in 1997.

The Hottest Ticket in Town: Husker Baseball

In the last five years, the increased interest in the Nebraska baseball program has resulted in record-shattering ticket sales. The Huskers have broken season ticket marks in each of the past three years and is already on another record-setting pace in 2004.

Over the past five years, NU has seen its season attendance jump from under 1,000 per game in 1999 to a school-record 4,299 in 2003, a total which ranked sixth nationally. The Huskers have

ranked in the top-10 nationally in each of the past two years, a fact made more remarkable in that Nebraska's attendance is based on tickets used - not tickets sold. Nebraska has exceeded the 4,000 mark for season tickets sold for the third straight year, selling 4,359 season tickets as of March 1.
