## Huskers Head to Omaha to take on Creighton

After completing a five-game homestand, the Huskers will make their shortest trek of the season on Tuesday, traveling to Omaha for a matchup with the Creighton Bluejays. First pitch at the CU Sports Complex for the 95th meeting between the Cornhuskers and Bluejays is slated for 3 p.m. The game will be carried throughout Nebraska on the Pinnacle Sports Network, while live stats will be available at Huskers.com.

Both teams come into the matchup playing their best ball of the early season. The Huskers, who climbed to as high as 17th (Sports Weekly/ESPN) in the national polls on Monday, are 13-4 and winners of six straight after sweeping Boston College last weekend. NU has won eight of its last nine games and has used a pitching staff that has been dominant in that span, posting a 2.04 ERA in that stretch.

The Huskers will be tested against a Creighton squad that is 8-8 on the year, but has won five of its last six games, including 2-of-3 at then No. 21 Oklahoma two weeks ago. The Bluejays have scored 49 runs over their last three games, including a 26-run outburst against Winona State on Saturday.

Nebraska has enjoyed the upper hand over the Bluejays in recent years, winning 10 of the past 12 meetings, including a series sweep last season. Creighton's last win in the series came in an 8-3 win over the then-No. 12 Huskers on April 9, 2002, NU's last visit to the CU Sports Complex. Nebraska, which holds a 54-38-2 lead in the all-time series, will be shooting for its sixth straight win in the series.

For both teams, Tuesday's matchup is their final tune-up for conference play. The Huskers will host Kansas (21-9-1) in a three-game set at Hawks Field beginning Friday afternoon, while Creighton opens up MVC play at Southwest Missouri State this weekend.

### Leading Off

• Nebraska has been nearly flawless in the field, committing one error over the last six games for a .996 fielding percentage. NU currently has a streak of 40.2 innings without an error, lifting its season fielding total to a season-high .974. The last time NU went five straight games without an error was

last May 16-22.

• Nebraska has gotten off to quick starts, scoring at least one run in the first inning of 12 of its first 17 games. In fact, NU is outscoring opponents 27-5 in the opening frame and 72-17 over the first three innings. The Huskers have also been able to close games out, outscoring opponents 41-19 from the seventh inning on.

• Another key to the Husker attack has been getting the leadoff hitter on base every inning. This season, NU has had its leadoff hitter reach safely nearly 50 percent of the time (74-of-151).

• Nebraska's bullpen was nearly perfect in the sweep of Boston College, tossing 11.1 innings of shutout ball and holding the Eagles to a .139 average. The six Husker relievers also combined for eight strikeouts without issuing a walk.

• Nebraska is 63-11 (.851) since moving into Hawks Field at the start of the 2002 season.

• With this week's ranking in the national polls, the Huskers have now been ranked in each of the past 74 polls, dating back to April of 2000.

• With last Wednesday's win over Western Illinois, Nebraska has now won 26 straight home openers, dating back to the 1979 season.

• Nebraska has been able to successfully manufacture runs during the early part of the season. The Huskers are second in the Big 12 with 30 sacrifice bunts, trailing Texas' total of 39 (through 29 games). NU's total in 17 games is more than half the entire season total of the 2001 (48) and 2002 (49) team totals.

Second baseman Jake Mullinax has been one of NU's main catalysts, with a team-high 10 sacrifices. Mullinax, who is also among the Big 12 leaders with a .379 average, is only seven sacrifice hits behind the school mark of 17 set by Joe Simokaitis in 2003.

NU's five sacrifices against New Mexico on Feb. 20, marked the first time any NCAA team had at least five sacrifices in a game since the 2001 season. Last weekend, both Nebraska and Texas accomplished the feat in a three-day span. Only two teams have ever recorded 100 sacrifice hits in a





### Head Coach Mike Anderson

Northern Colorado, 1990  
(60-22 (.731) - Second Season)

Mike Anderson is in his second season as Nebraska's head baseball coach, becoming the 23rd head coach in the program's history on June 21, 2002. Anderson has been associated with the NU program for the last decade, serving as an assistant from the fall of 1994 until his promotion to head coach in 2002.

Since joining the Nebraska staff in the fall of 1994, he has coached a total of 15 first-team all-conference honorees, while 19 of his former players have signed professional contracts. His most famous protegee is current Anaheim Angel All-Star Darin Erstad, who earned first-team All-America honors in 1995, when he was the first overall selection in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Seven Huskers have been tabbed first-team All-Americans under Anderson's tutelage, while four players – Erstad (1995), Harvey (1999), Dan Johnson (2001) and Jed Morris (2002) – have been finalists for various national player-of-the-year awards.

In 2003, Anderson guided Nebraska to a 47-18 record. After being picked fourth in the preseason by the league coaches, the Huskers won the Big 12 regular-season title with a 20-7 record, clinching the title on the final day of the season. He became the second first-year Husker coach to lead NU to a conference title and the first since 1929.

The Huskers led the Big 12 in hitting in each of Anderson's final four seasons as an assistant coach, including a .338 team average – the second highest in school history – in 1999. The Huskers led the Big 12 in seven offensive categories in 2002, including batting average (.315), hits (753), runs scored (543), doubles (154), RBIs (491), sacrifice hits (49) and sacrifice flies (46). In 2001, Anderson coached a Husker offense that ranked in the top-10 nationally in both team average (.334) and runs per game (9.20), while also finishing second nationally in total hits (787) and runs scored (607).

As the outfielders coach, Anderson has coached three All-Americans and seven all-conference selections, including Jeff Leise, who was a first-team All-American in 2002, while leading the Huskers to their second straight College World Series appearance.

Anderson's commitment to his student-athletes also extends to the classroom. Over the past nine years, the Huskers have placed 40 players on the first-team all-conference squad. Nebraska has had eight CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, including two in each of the past three seasons and 11 first-team academic all-district selections in the past seven seasons.

Before arriving in Lincoln in the fall of 1994, Anderson was the top assistant coach at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colo. He joined the Bears' staff after four years as a head coach with the Northern Colorado Lab School. From 1983 through 1986, Anderson was an outfielder at Northern Colorado for College Hall of Fame Coach Tom Petroff. Anderson was an eighth-round pick by the California Angels, spending four seasons with the Angels organization.

Anderson earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Northern Colorado in 1990. Anderson graduated from Eaton High School in Eaton, Colo., where he was a first-team All-Colorado shortstop for Coach Jim Danley.

Senior Justin Pekarek looks for his team-best third win of the season on Tuesday when he takes the hill against Creighton Tuesday afternoon...fifth-year senior who is 2-0 with a 6.03 ERA in five appearances, including four starts...has pitched well of late, tossing seven shutout innings over his last two appearances, holding UCLA and Western Illinois to a .167 average...scattered three hits over five scoreless innings against Western Illinois last Wednesday for the win, striking out four in the Huskers' 8-0 win....came out of the bullpen against UCLA on March 13, tossing two scoreless innings in a 4-2 loss to the Bruins...struck out a career-high six Mountaineers in his last start against West Virginia on March 7, but allowed four runs on eight hits in just 3.1 innings...turned in one of the best outings of his career against No. 15 North Carolina on Feb. 29...earned the win against the Tar Heels, allowing four runs on six hits in 5.1 innings of work...retired 14 of 15 Tar Heels at one point, including 11 straight entering the sixth inning...allowed five runs on six hits in 3.1 innings at New Mexico (2/21) before leaving with a 6-5 lead...chosen one of three captains by a vote of his teammates after fall drills...enjoyed a breakthrough summer pitching for the Santa Barbara Foresters, compiling a 5-2 mark and a 1.41 ERA in leading the Foresters to a 51-10-1 record and an appearance in the finals of the NBC World Series. **vs. Creighton:** Made two relief appearances last year against the Bluejays, allowing one run in 1.2 innings of work...tossed a scoreless ninth inning to cap NU's 8-0 shutout of Creighton on April 29. **2003 Highlights:** Went 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA in 17 innings of work...earned his first career win against Western Illinois on April 2, allowing three runs in five innings...tossed a complete-game (6 IP because of rain) win against South Dakota, striking out five and allowing one run...missed all of 2002 season after elbow surgery. **2001 Highlights:** Went 0-1 with a save and a 3.88 ERA in three outings, holding opponents to a .125 average...earned a save in three innings of no-hit ball against Lamar...missed over three months with an elbow injury before taking the loss against Tulane in the CWS, allowing three runs in a 6-5 loss to the Green Wave. **2000 Highlights:** Redshirted.

## 2003 Series Review

**Nebraska 8, Creighton 7 (April 22):** John Grose's bases-loaded single with one out in the bottom of the ninth broke a 7-all tie, as the Huskers pulled out an 8-7 win. Grose, who went 2-for-5 with an RBI, sent Bluejay closer Steve Grasley's first pitch to the wall in right center, allowing Joe Simokaitis to score from third with the winning run. Offensively, Curtis Ledbetter and Alex Gordon had two hits apiece, while Jason Burch was the beneficiary of Grose's heroics after allowing two unearned runs in three innings of relief.

**Nebraska 8, Creighton 0 (April 29):** Phil Shirek fired eight shutout innings, leading fourth-ranked Nebraska to an 8-0 victory over Creighton. Shirek allowed two singles as only one Bluejay got into scoring position, as his eight innings of work marked the longest outing of his career. Nebraska's offense pounded 12 hits off seven Bluejay pitchers, as Daniel Bruce led NU's offensive barrage, going 3-for-4 with three RBIs, while Jeff Leise, Matt Hopper and Curtis Ledbetter had two hits apiece. With the win, NU clinched the season series over the Bluejays for the fifth straight season.

**Nebraska 9, Creighton 5 (May 13)** -- Daniel Bruce went 4-for-5 with a pair of RBIs, leading the Huskers to a 9-5 win over Creighton in front of more than 11,000 fans at Rosenblatt Stadium. The sophomore keyed the Huskers' offensive attack with his four hits and added two stolen bases, as Nebraska jumped to an 8-0 lead before CU mounted a late comeback. Bruce had four of Nebraska's 11 hits, while Drew Anderson matched a season high with three RBIs, as Nebraska completed the season sweep of the Bluejays and reached 40 wins for the fifth consecutive season. Zach Kroenke earned the win, throwing five shutout innings to improve to 5-2 on the season, while Pat O'Neil pitched the final 2.1 innings for his second save of the year.

## John Grose • C • 5-11 • 205 • Sr. • Henderson, Nev.

Three-year starter and team co-captain for the second straight season...career .339 hitter who has gotten off to a slow start, hitting just .108 through 11 games...broke an 0-for-25 stretch with two hits vs. SDSU, and his hitting .267 since...went 2-for-8 against Boston College, including a pair of runs scored in Sunday's win...has thrown out 57 percent of base stealers this season...has a .304 OBP, as he leads the team with six hit-by-pitches...went 2-for-7 with a pair of RBIs at New Mexico...went 1-for-2 with a pair of runs scored vs. Kent State...hit a career-high three times and scored twice vs. Northwestern...strong defensive presence behind the plate who excels at handling pitchers and controlling the running game...hit .302 with four homers and 22 RBIs in 2003, as he battled an elbow injury...split time with All-American Jed Morris in 2002, batting .384 with four homers and 38 RBIs...drafted in the 35th round of the 2001 draft by Atlanta and the 42nd round of the 2000 draft by the Chicago White Sox.

## Curtis Ledbetter • 1B • 6-3 • 220 • Jr. • Lawrence, Kan.

Returning first-team All-Big 12 designated hitter who moved to first base this spring...preseason NCBWA All-American who hit .348 with 13 homers and 54 RBIs in 2003...enters the week with a .243 average and is tied for third on the team with 14 RBIs...has four multi-RBI games, including a trio of three RBI games...solid defensive first baseman who has not made an error in 173 chances in 2004...was hitting .125 through the first five games before hitting .304 with 10 RBIs over the last 12 games...went just 2-for-12 with an RBI vs. BC last weekend...was 2-for-6 with two runs scored in the doubleheader vs. WIU...went 2-for-5 with a double and three RBIs vs. SDSU on Sunday...came off the bench for a pinch-hit two-run single vs. UCLA (3/13)...had a season-high three hits vs. West Virginia (3/7)...went 2-for-5 with three RBIs vs. No. 15 North Carolina (2/29)...also drove in three runs vs. New Mexico (2/21)...is 7-for-9 with three homers and 24 RBIs with the bases loaded during NU career...third in the Big 12 in homers and slugging percentage (.647), while ranking in the top 20 in hitting in 2003...has two career multi-homer games (last vs. KSU on 3/20/03)...played one year at Garden City (Kan.) CC, batting .404 with 13 homers and 55 RBIs...drafted in the 39th round by the Cleveland Indians in the 2000 MLB First-Year Player Draft.

## Jake Mullinax • 2B • 6-1 • 205 • Sr. • Hesperia, Calif.

Senior co-captain who is NU's returning starter at second...enters the week with a .379 average, while pacing NU in sacrifices (10) and is second in runs scored (18)...has hit second or third in the lineup all season...is the only player in the Big 12 hitting .360 or better with 10 or more sacrifices...hit .300 (3-for-10) vs. BC but also drew two walks and was hit by two pitches...went 3-for-7 vs. Western Illinois...led NU with a .429 average (6-for-14) in San Diego, including three-hit games vs. USD and SDSU...was 4-for-12 at Minnesota and had three hits and drove in a career-high four runs vs. WVU (3/5), including a three-run inside-the-park homer, the first by a Husker since the 2000 season...tied or set then-career high in hits (4), RBIs (3) and runs scored (4) vs. Kent State (2/22), including first career homer...has a .984 fielding percentage, committing one error in 64 chances...honorable-mention All-Big 12 selection who hit .320 with 21 RBIs and 30 runs scored in 2003...had .470 OBP and was hit by a team-high 17 pitches in 2003...closed 2003 on a tear, hitting .480 during the Big 12 Tourney and NCAA Regional...selected to the NCAA Regional all-tournament team, batting .571 (8-for-14) with five RBIs...did not enroll until January of 2003...spent two seasons at Victory Valley Community College, batting .477 with nine homers and 37 RBIs to earn conference MVP honors in 2002.

## Joe Simokaitis • SS • 6-1 • 195 • Jr. • St. Louis, Mo.

Third-year starter who anchors one of the Big 12's best infields...is fourth in the Big 12 in hitting with a .407 average with 14 RBIs, six doubles and a team-high six stolen bases...hit .563 with five RBIs during NU's recent homestand...went 8-for-12 with five RBIs vs. Boston College, posting three-hit games on Friday and Saturday...had three hits, including a ninth-inning RBI single off BC ace Chris Lambert and drove in four runs in the series finale...went 5-for-13 with three runs scored at the Minnesota Tourney...hit .400 (4-for-10) with two doubles and two runs scored at Rice Tourney...has eight multi-hit games, including a career-best four hits vs. Kent State (2/22)...hit .293 with a homer and 39 RBIs in 2003...set a school mark with 194 assists in 2003...led the nation with 16 sacrifice bunts in 2003...his 29 career sacrifices entering this week are the most by any active Division I player (20th all time)...hit .236 with 16 RBIs as a freshman, helping NU to the College World Series...attended St. Mary's High School in St. Louis, the same alma mater of former Major Leaguers Yogi Berra and Joe Garagiola.

## Alex Gordon • 3B • 6-1 • 215 • So. • Lincoln, Neb.

### Welcome to Hawks Field at Haymarket Park

The 2002 season marked the debut of the Huskers' new home – Hawks Field at Haymarket Park. The field is named in memory of Myrna Hawks, as the Hawks family was one of the major benefactors in the Haymarket Park project.

In March of 2000, Howard and Myrna Hawks guaranteed the unfunded portion of UNL's \$10.6 million commitment to the baseball/softball complex, which enabled the University to move forward in a joint venture with the City of Lincoln and NEBCO, Inc., the owners of the Lincoln Saltdogs in the Northern League. The University retained the right to name the field and on Feb. 23, 2002, the University of Nebraska Board of Regents approved the name of Hawks Field. It was formally dedicated in pregame ceremonies against Kansas on April 28, 2002. The ballpark includes 4,500 chair-back seats, 16 suites, a Diamond View Lounge and a Sub-Air system that allows the field to grow grass nearly year-round. The park is one of only three fields in the country that uses this state-of-the-art heating system (Invesco Field at Mile High and Safeco Field are the others). Other highlights of the complex include a 1,400-square foot clubhouse for the Husker baseball program, a video board/scoreboard in right center field, the Buck Beltzer Playground for kids down the right field line and numerous restrooms and concession stands.

Hawks Field, as well as the adjacent Bowlin Stadium – the 2,500-seat softball stadium which opened in the fall of 2001 – are both located inside Haymarket Park, a 32-acre complex that includes both stadiums as well as the plaza area and 2,000 parking stalls. The 2002 season marked the first time since World War II that the Huskers did not play at the former sight of Buck Beltzer Stadium on the Nebraska campus.

### Last Time Out

The Huskers completed a 5-0 homestand by sweeping Boston College over the weekend. The Huskers sandwiched a pair of 10-1 wins around a 3-2 victory in 10 innings.

**Friday (Nebraska 10, Boston College 1)** -- Zach Kroenke scattered three hits over 7.1 innings, as Nebraska topped Boston College, 10-1 in the series opener. The sophomore fanned eight - the second-highest total of his career - and took a shutout into the eighth for his first victory since Feb. 27. Daniel Bruce went 2-for-3 with three RBIs to lead the Huskers' 11-hit attack, while Colin Shockey was 2-for-3 with a pair of RBIs and three runs scored, as Nebraska jumped out to an 8-0 lead after three innings. Six different Huskers drove in at least one run, including Al Smith, who belted his first career homer – a solo shot to center - in the third.

**Saturday (Nebraska 3, Boston College 2)** -- Beau Sullivan's 10th-inning RBI single broke a 2-all tie, as Nebraska rallied for a 3-2 win over Boston College on Saturday. The Huskers trailed 2-1 after eight innings before tying the game on Joe Simokaitis' RBI single off BC ace Chris Lambert in the ninth scored Chad Steele, who opened the inning with a double and moved to third on Braden Keith's bunt single. Sullivan then gave NU its second extra-inning win with a one-out RBI single in the 10th off Eagle reliever Mike Gauthier. The Huskers received an outstanding relief performance from Tim Schoeninger, who tossed 6.2 innings of shutout relief for his second win of the year. Schoeninger got the Huskers out of a two-on, one-out situation

in the fourth and then allowed only one BC runner into scoring position the rest of the way.

**Sunday (Nebraska 10, Boston College 1)** – Alex Gordon and Joe Simokaitis drove in four runs each, as Nebraska completed the weekend sweep of Boston College with a 10-1 victory Sunday afternoon at Hawks Field. Gordon went 2-for-3 while his three-run homer in the third inning broke a 1-all tie, as the Huskers won their sixth straight game and improved to 13-4 on the season. Simokaitis had three hits and set a career high with four RBIs, including a two-run double in the third, as NU scored five runs off Eagle starter Matt O'Donnell. The early offensive output was more than enough for Phil Shirek and three relievers who combined on a four hitter. Shirek, improved to 3-0, allowed one run on six hits over six innings, while Jeremy Becker, Dustin Timm and Mike Sillman each worked a perfect inning of relief to complete the win.

### Newcomers Adapting to Outfield Success

With the graduation of three-year starter Jeff Leise and the redshirt season of Brandon Fusilier, a trio of newcomers have seen extensive action in the Husker outfield. Junior College transfers Colin Shockey and Jesse Boyer and true freshman Braden Keith have keyed NU's fast start.

Boyer, who redshirted last spring, started NU's first 13 contests and is hitting .353 with 17 runs scored and an on-base percentage of .485 before suffering a leg injury against Western Illinois. In his stead, center fielder Colin Shockey stepped into Boyer's leadoff spot and hitting .333 with a team-high five runs scored vs. Boston College. On the year, Shockey, who also pitched a scoreless inning of relief against BC, is hitting .358 with 11 RBIs in 15 starts in center. Keith, who has seen increased playing time in recent games, is hitting .296 with eight walks in just 27 at-bats.

### Huskers Excel at Turning Two

While the infield duo of Joe Simokaitis and Jake Mullinax have enjoyed strong offensive starts, the pair have excelled in the middle infield. Simokaitis, a three-year starter at short, and Mullinax, a converted junior college shortstop, helped Nebraska turn a Big 12-leading 70 double plays in 2003. This spring, NU has continued to rely on double plays, turning 19 and averaging over one per game.

### NU Shows Outstanding Penmanship

One strength for Nebraska early on has been a deep relief corps. The Husker bullpen has a 4-1 record with a 2.28 ERA, while converting four of five save opportunities. Four different pitchers have a save, while NU has allowed just 10 of 35 inherited runners to score. The bullpen has allowed just six extra-base hits in 59.0 innings of work.

Jeremy Becker has not allowed any of his seven inherited runners to score in his four appearances, while Dustin Timm (1-of-8) and Tim Schoeninger (1-of-8) have also shined in keeping inherited runners off the scoreboard. NU has tossed 15.0 scoreless innings since the nightcap of the Western Illinois series last Wednesday.

### The Hottest Ticket in Town: Husker Baseball

In the last five years, the increased interest in the Nebraska baseball program has resulted in record-shattering ticket sales. The Huskers have broke season ticket marks in each of the past three years and is already on another record-setting pace in 2004.

Over the past five years, NU has seen its season attendance jump from under 1,000 per game in 1999 to a school-record 4,299 in 2003, a total which ranked sixth nationally. The Huskers have

ranked in the top-10 nationally in each of the past two years, a fact made more remarkable in that Nebraska's attendance is based on tickets used - not tickets sold. ## Four Huskers Honored by Dallas Morning News

Nebraska and Texas were the only schools to have more than two first-team selections.

## Bruce Voted Best Outfield Arm in Big 12

Junior outfielder Daniel Bruce was voted as having the best defensive arm in the Big 12 in a poll of conference coaches for Baseball America. The Omaha native had a team-high six outfield assists in 2003, and has nine outfield assists in his two seasons as a Husker. Bruce, who could see time in both center and right field, batted .311 with six homers and 33 RBIs as a sophomore.

## Huskers Honored for Academic Work

A total of 15 Husker baseball players were honored earlier this month with selection to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll. The baseball players were among 286 Husker student-athletes who were recognized for their success in the classroom.
