Huskers Close Homestand With Wichita State

The Nebraska baseball team closes a six-game homestand Tuesday evening when No. 11 Wichita State makes a visit to Hawks Field. First pitch is set for 6:35 p.m. and tickets are available by calling the NU Ticket Office at 800-8-Big Red or at Hawks Field 90 minutes prior to first pitch. The game will be carried on the Pinnacle Sports Network with Jim Rose and Gary Sharp, while the game will also be video-streamed on HuskersNside.

The Huskers, who dipped to 17th in the Collegiate Baseball poll and 19th by Baseball America, look to bounce back after dropping the final two games of the series against Texas Tech over the weekend. It not only marked the first conference series loss since March of 2003, but also snapped the Huskers' 13 home series winning streak that dated back to 2001.

The Huskers (24-7, 6-3 Big 12) had been on a roll before Saturday, winning nine straight games and 17 of their last 18 before the current two-game losing streak. Tuesday's matchup between the Huskers and Shockers features two of the top programs in the Midwest. The Shockers come to town with a 20-5 record after a four-game sweep of Illinois State last weekend. This will mark the fourth straight year the teams have met during the regular season, as the Shockers have won the past three meetings, including a 7-5 victory in Wichita last April. WSU leads the all-time series, 19-16 in a series that goes back to 1950.

Following Tuesday's game, the Huskers, who are in third place in the Big 12 with a 6-3 league mark, will hit the road, playing six of their next seven games away from Hawks Field, including weekend series at Missouri and Texas.

Leading Off

• - The Huskers have been perched in the national polls for the past 77 weeks, dating back to April of 2000. To put that in perspective, the only current Husker to have been on a team that was unranked in his career is fifth-year senior Justin Pekarek, who was redshirting in 2000.

• - The series loss to Texas Tech dampened the Huskers' blistering start, as NU's 23-5 record at the midway point was the second-best start in school history. Only the 1983 squad, which opened with

a 26-2 start, including a school-record 26 game winning streak, enjoyed a better start than the 2004 Huskers.

• - NU's current .978 fielding percentage is on pace to break the school record of .971 set in 1994 and 1995. The Huskers are a perfect 14-0 this season when they play errorless baseball and have a pair of stretches of at least 45 innings without an error, including a stretch of 63.1 innings last month.

• - Curtis Ledbetter has been on a tear since returning to the lineup after a shoulder injury. The first baseman from Lawrence, Kan., is hitting .375 with three homers and 14 RBIs over his last nine games, raising his season average to .297.

• - Nebraska is 70-14 (.833) since moving into Hawks Field at the start of the 2002 season, including a 12-3 mark at home

• - The Huskers tossed four consecutive shutouts from March 30 to April 3, marking only the second time in school history that NU has blanked four straight opponents and the first since a four-game stretch in 1977 and 1978. NU had never tossed four straight shutouts in a single season before last week. In fact, the four shutouts nearly equaled all of last season's total of five.

• - A pair of Huskers were honored last week, as sophomore left-hander Zach Kroenke was named Big 12 Pitcher of the Week on Tuesday after a complete-game one-hitter against Kansas State. The Omaha native followed up with eight innings of one-run ball against Texas Tech on Friday to improve to 6-0 and lower his ERA to 1.94.

On Wednesday, third baseman Alex Gordon was one of four Big 12 players named to the Golden Spikes Watch List. The sophomore from Lincoln enters Tuesday's game with Wichita State hitting .372 with 11 homers and 45 RBIs. Gordon is third in the league in both homers and RBIs, while topping the Big 12 in slugging (.805) and on-base percentage (.497).



Head Coach Mike Anderson
Northern Colorado, 1990
(71-25 (.740) - Second Season)

Mike Anderson is in his second season as Nebraska's head baseball coach, becoming the 23rd head coach in the program's history on June 21, 2002. Anderson has been associated with the NU program for the last decade, serving as an assistant from the fall of 1994 until his promotion to head coach in 2002.

Since joining the Nebraska staff in the fall of 1994, he has coached a total of 15 first-team all-conference honorees, while 19 of his former players have signed professional contracts. His most famous protege is current Anaheim Angel All-Star Darin Erstad, who earned first-team All-America honors in 1995, when he was the first overall selection in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Seven Huskers have been tabbed first-team All-Americans under Anderson's tutelage, while four players – Erstad (1995), Harvey (1999), Dan Johnson (2001) and Jed Morris (2002) – have been finalists for various national player-of-the-year awards.

In 2003, Anderson guided Nebraska to a 47-18 record. After being picked fourth in the preseason by the league coaches, the Huskers won the Big 12 regular-season title with a 20-7 record, clinching the title on the final day of the season. He became the second first-year Husker coach to lead NU to a conference title and the first since 1929.

The Huskers led the Big 12 in hitting in each of Anderson's final four seasons as an assistant coach, including a .338 team average – the second highest in school history – in 1999. The Huskers led the Big 12 in seven offensive categories in 2002, including batting average (.315), hits (753), runs scored (543), doubles (154), RBIs (491), sacrifice hits (49) and sacrifice flies (46). In 2001, Anderson coached a Husker offense that ranked in the top-10 nationally in both team average (.334) and runs per game (9.20), while also finishing second nationally in total hits (787) and runs scored (607).

As the outfielders coach, Anderson has coached three All-Americans and seven all-conference selections, including Jeff Leise, who was a first-team All-American in 2002, while leading the Huskers to their second straight College World Series appearance.

Anderson's commitment to his student-athletes also extends to the classroom. Over the past nine years, the Huskers have placed 40 players on the first-team all-conference squad. Nebraska has had eight CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, including two in each of the past three seasons and 11 first-team academic all-district selections in the past seven seasons.

Before arriving in Lincoln in the fall of 1994, Anderson was the top assistant coach at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colo. He joined the Bears' staff after four years as a head coach with the Northern Colorado Lab School. From 1983 through 1986, Anderson was an outfielder at Northern Colorado for College Hall of Fame Coach Tom Petroff. Anderson was an eighth-round pick by the California Angels, spending four seasons with the Angels organization.

Anderson earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Northern Colorado in 1990. Anderson graduated from Eaton High School in Eaton, Colo., where he was a first-team All-Colorado shortstop for Coach Jim Danley.

Tuesday's Starter vs. Wichita State

2004: Preseason All-American who has won his last two starts, upping his record to 3-4 heading into Tuesday's matchup with Wichita State...overcame a rocky start to pitch well in Nebraska's 7-3 victory over New Mexico last Monday in his last appearance...went 5.2 innings, scattering nine hits, while matching his career high with seven strikeouts...has gone five or more innings in six of his eight starts, including a season-high eight innings in a loss to No. 2 Rice on Feb. 28...has a 4-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio, as he has walked just six batters in 40.1 innings of work...turned in a strong five-inning performance in Nebraska's 9-0 win over UW-Milwaukee (3/30), striking out four and scattering four singles in his first win since Feb. 22...allowed a first-inning single before retiring the next 13 batters he faced...went just 2.1 innings, the second-shortest start of his NU career, allowing five runs on seven hits in NU's 12-9 loss to KU (3/28)...had a four-start stretch from Feb. 28 to March 20 where he was 0-3 with a 3.22 ERA, as NU totaled just eight runs in those four games (NU was 1-3 in those games)...allowed four runs - two earned in six innings against UCLA (3/13)...took a shutout into the sixth vs. Minnesota, but allowed a pair of runs in a 3-1 loss to the Gophers (3/6)...scattered seven hits, but had six strikeouts, one off a career high vs. Minnesota...pitched well in a loss at No. 2 Rice, allowing four runs - two earned - in eight innings of NU's 4-2 loss...earned his first win against Kent State on Feb. 22. **vs. Wichita State:** Did not pitch in last year's loss to the Shockers. **2003 Highlights:** Enjoyed one of the finest years a Husker newcomer has ever had...compiled a 10-2 record and a 4.23 ERA in 89.1 innings...tied for the Big 12 lead with 10 wins (also Texas' J.P. Howell), a total which was the third-most in school history...his 10 wins in 2003 were the most ever by a first-year Husker pitcher and only All-Americans Shane Komine and Troy Brohawn won more games in a season at NU...ranked 10th in the Big 12 in opposing batting average (.270) and 12th in ERA...was second to Big 12 Pitcher-of-the-Year Aaron Marsden in starts (14), innings pitched (89.1) and strikeouts (51)...had nearly a 2.5-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio, and went six or more innings in 12 of his 14 starts, including each of his final 10...tossed a complete game against Oklahoma State on May 11, allowing two runs in a 5-2 win over the Cowboys...went a perfect 2-0 in two postseason starts, going six innings in wins over No. 16 Baylor in Oklahoma City and Eastern Michigan. **Prior:** Went a combined 15-3 with a 3.18 ERA at Texarkana (Texas) College...earned second-team NJCAA All-America honors in 2001, going 9-0 with a 3.45 ERA...drafted by the New York Yankees in the 17th round of the 2001 MLB Draft.

Last Season's Matchup

Last Season (Wichita State 7, Nebraska 5) - The Huskers jumped out to an early four-run lead but could not withstand a late Wichita State rally, falling to the Shockers, 7-5, at Eck Stadium. Nebraska took an early 5-1 lead on an RBI double by Jake Mullinax in the second before scoring four in the third on a three-run triple by Curtis Ledbetter, who extended his hitting streak to 10 games, and an RBI single by Alex Gordon. Joe Simokaitis and Gordon, who has hit safely in a career-high 12 straight games, had four of NU's eight hits, while Phil Shirek went the first five innings, allowing three runs on five hits, but did not factor in the decision. Pat O'Neil took the loss, allowing four runs in 1.2 innings of relief. Drew Moffitt went 3-for-4 with a homer and four RBIs in the win for the Shockers.

Scouting the Shockers

Under longtime coach Gene Stephenson (1,420-454-3 in 27 seasons), the Shockers come to Lincoln with a 20-5 record after sweeping Illinois State in a four-game series last weekend. The Shockers bring a potent offense to town, as they are hitting .334 as a team with eight of the nine starters above the .300 mark. Drew Moffitt has a team-high 13 homers and drove in 33 runs, after belting six homers last week. Moffitt also has 27 walks and team bests on on-base (.522) and slugging percentage (.936). Logan Sorensen paced WSU with a .371 average, 33 RBIs and a team-high 16 stolen bases. On the mound, the Shockers will likely throw senior right-hander Kyle Banick (1-1, 4.50 ERA in seven appearances) against NU, as he makes his first start of the year. WSU has a staff ERA of 2.92 and is holding foes to a .219 average. Three of WSU's five losses have come to nationally ranked teams.

Last Time Out

Texas Tech snapped the Huskers' streak of 10 straight series wins by taking 2-of-3 from the Huskers at Hawks Field over the weekend. It marked the first time that NU had dropped a conference series at Hawks Field and snapped NU's streak of 13 straight league series wins at home dating back to 2001.

Friday (Nebraska 3, Texas Tech 1)– Zach Kroenke allowed one run over eight innings, while Curtis Ledbetter and Jake Mullinax hit back-to-back homers in the second inning, as No. 12 Nebraska downed Texas Tech, 3-1, for their ninth straight Friday evening. Kroenke, who improved to 6-0, allowed a first-inning run, but settled down and didn't allow a run over his last seven innings. The left-hander struck out nine in eight innings before Mike Sillman pitched a perfect ninth for his fourth save. The Huskers were held to a season-low four hits, but used back-to-back round trippers by Mullinax and Ledbetter off Texas Tech starter Steven Thomas to open the second and erase a 1-0 deficit. Mullinax also added NU's third run on a six-inning sacrifice fly.

Saturday (Texas Tech 10, Nebraska 7) – Josh Brady's two-run triple in the sixth inning gave Texas Tech the lead for good, as the Red Raiders ended Nebraska's nine-game winning streak with a 10-7 victory on Saturday. Brady's hit erased a 7-6 Husker lead, while Adam Fry struck out six in 3.2 innings of scoreless relief for his first save. Curtis Ledbetter had a team-high three hits and drove in two runs, while Colin Shockey went 2-for-5 with two RBIs for NU. Jake Mullinax also had two RBIs and hit his sixth homer of the season. Dustin Timm took the loss in relief, striking out four over a career-long four innings, but allowed two runs to drop to 1-1 on the season.

Sunday (Texas Tech 10, Nebraska 3) – Jesse Boyer went 3-for-4 with three RBIs, but Texas Tech took the rubber match of the three-game series with a 10-3 win on Sunday. The Husker left fielder provided most of the offense, as the Red Raiders took control with a five-run fourth inning. Colin Shockey had two hits, while Braden Keith went 1-for-3 with two runs scored. Justin Pekarek took the loss, allowing five runs – all unearned – on seven hits in 3.2 innings, as Texas Tech had 17 hits off five Husker pitchers. Josh Brady went 2-for-5 with five RBIs, including a three-run homer for the winners.

Ouch!

Husker hitters have been hit at an alarming rate over the first half of the season. Nebraska hitters have been hit 67 times, including 16 games of three or more. The Huskers have been hit 42 times over the last 16 games, including a season-high six times against UW-Milwaukee on March 30. Colin Shockey leads the Huskers with 14 HBPs, while Daniel Bruce has been hit 12 times, increasing his school record to 54 in 149 career games. At the current rate, NU's projected 56-game regular-season total would threaten the NCAA record of 125 set by Nevada in 1997.

Pitchers Set Big 12 Mark

Two weeks ago, the Nebraska pitching staff established a record with 43.1 scoreless innings. The record, which included 42 complete innings and parts of two others, broke the Big 12 record of 41 set by Texas in 2002. In all, the Husker pitchers tossed a pair of one-hitters, a three-hitter and a five-hitter before Kansas State scored a run in the fourth inning of NU's win. Oklahoma held the Big Eight record with 31 straight scoreless innings in 1971, while Arizona State set the NCAA mark with 64 straight scoreless innings back in 1972.

Up Next

After playing 17 of the last 20 games inside the state, the Huskers return to the road this weekend when they travel to Missouri. Friday's game is slated for 6:30 p.m. with afternoon tilts set for Saturday (2 p.m.) and Sunday (1 p.m.). All three games will be on the radio, but Saturday's game will be aired in progress following the Red/White Spring game. NU's next home game is April 20, against Creighton at 6:35 p.m.

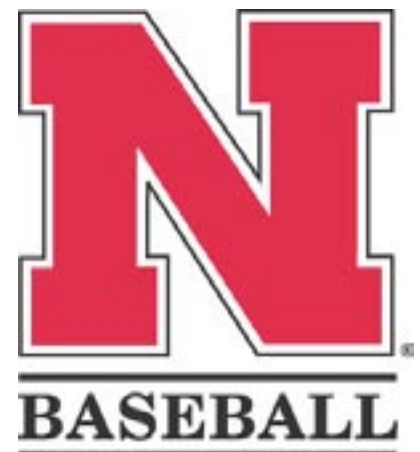

The Hottest Ticket in Town: Husker Baseball

In the last five years, the increased interest in the Nebraska baseball program has resulted in record-shattering ticket sales. The Huskers have broken season ticket marks in each of the past three years and is already on another record-setting pace in 2004.

Over the past five years, NU has seen its season attendance jump from under 1,000 per game in 1999 to a school-record 4,299 in 2003, a total which ranked sixth nationally. The Huskers have

ranked in the top-10 nationally in each of the past two years, a fact made more remarkable in that Nebraska's attendance is based on tickets used - not tickets sold. Nebraska has exceeded the 4,000 mark for season tickets sold for the third straight year, selling 4,359 season tickets as of March 1.

Sophomore third baseman Alex Gordon earned a pair of honors by Baseball America in the publication's preseason issue. The Lincoln native was the only Husker chosen to the magazine's preseason All-Big 12 team. Gordon, who batted .319 with seven homers and 48 RBIs last season, was also chosen No. 28 among the nation's top-50 sophomores, as the magazine listed to the top-50 prospects in each class.

Huskers in Professional Baseball

At the start of the 2004 season, a total of 15 former Huskers are listed on Major League or Minor League rosters. The list is headlined by five Huskers who finished the 2003 campaign in the Major Leagues. The list is led by two-time American League All-Star Darin Erstad, who was the No. 1 overall pick by the Angels in 1995. Other Major League Huskers include Kansas City Royals first baseman Ken Harvey (1997-99), Los Angeles Dodgers pitcher Troy Brohawn (1992-94), San Diego Padre Todd Sears (1995-97) and Seattle Mariner Jamal Strong (1999-2000), who was called up last September. In all, a total of 19 former Huskers have reached the Major Leagues. In Baseball America's 2004 Top Prospects list, Strong was the Mariners' 10th-best prospect, while Dan Johnson, a seventh-round pick of Oakland in 2001, is listed as the organization's No. 3 prospect.

Four Huskers Honored by Dallas Morning News

Four Huskers were honored by the Dallas Morning News on the publication's preseason All-Big 12 team. Junior Curtis Ledbetter (DH), Joe Simokaitis (SS) and Quinton Robertson (RHP) were chosen for the first team, while Jake Mullinax (2B) was the lone Husker chosen for the second team. Nebraska and Texas were the only schools to have more than two first-team selections.

Bruce Voted Best Outfield Arm in Big 12

Junior outfielder Daniel Bruce was voted as having the best defensive arm in the Big 12 in a poll of conference coaches for Baseball America. The Omaha native had a team-high six outfield assists in 2003, and 11 outfield assists in his three seasons as a Husker. Bruce, who could see time in both center and right field, batted .311 with six homers and 33 RBIs as a sophomore.

Huskers Honored for Academic Work

A total of 15 Husker baseball players were honored earlier this month with selection to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll. The baseball players were among 286 Husker student-athletes who were recognized for their success in the classroom.

The honorees are led by junior outfielder Daniel Bruce, who completed the fall semester with a 4.0 GPA in English. The Omaha native is a CoSIDA Academic All-America candidate and carries a 3.872 cumulative grade-point average. Other upperclassmen honored include senior captains John Grose, Justin Pekarek and Jake Mullinax and fellow senior Mike Sillman and former pitcher Jamie Rodrigue, who is completing his degree in physical education. Four true freshmen were also among the honorees, including catcher Johnny Bowden, infielder Al Smith and pitchers Matt Foust and Jon Klausung, as they all had 3.0 GPAs during their first semester on campus.
