Huskers Travel to Top-Ranked Texas This Weekend

The Nebraska baseball team looks to bounce back after a 6-4 loss to Creighton Tuesday evening, as the Huskers head to No. 1 Texas this weekend in Austin. The three-game series with the Longhorns (39-5, 11-3 Big 12) commences Friday at 6:15 p.m. before afternoon games on both Saturday (3 p.m.) and Sunday (1 p.m.). The games will be carried throughout the state on the Pinnacle Sports Network with Jim Rose and Gary Sharp calling all of the action (pregame show starts 20 minutes before first pitch) and live stats will be available at Huskers.com. While this weekend's games are not available on HuskersNSide, Saturday's tilt will be carried on Fox Sports Net in Big 12 markets with Greg Lucas (play-by-play) and former Houston Astros pitcher and manager Larry Dierker (analyst).

The Huskers (26-10, 7-5 Big 12), who are ranked between 16th (ESPN/Sports Weekly) and 22nd (Baseball America) in this week's polls, have a forboding task ahead, as the Longhorns are 22-2 at Disch-Falk Field and come into the series with a 39-5 mark. UT is in second place in the Big 12 with an 11-3 mark, a half game behind Oklahoma, which sits at 12-3. The Huskers are in fourth place in the league at 7-5, a half game behind Oklahoma State.

The series features the last three Big 12 champions (Nebraska in 2001 and 2003 and Texas in 2002), as the two teams have combined for four CWS appearances over the last three years (NU, 2001-02; Texas, 2002-03).

Nebraska has won the regular-season series in each of the last five years (1999-2003), taking 2-of-3 in Austin in both 2000 and 2002, the team's last matchup in Austin. In fact, NU is the only Big 12 team to hold an all-time lead over Texas, as NU is 17-11 all-time against the Longhorns, including wins in 11 of the past 16 meetings dating back to 1999.

After this weekend's trip to Texas, the Huskers return home to begin a five-game homestand next week, taking on Northern Colorado (Tuesday-Wednesday) and Texas A&M (Friday-Sunday). Tickets for all five games are available by calling the NU Ticket Office (800-8-Big Red) or at Hawks Field 90 minutes before each game.

Saturday's Game at Texas on Fox Sports Net

Saturday's game at Texas has been picked up for television by Fox Sports Net. The game, which was originally scheduled for a 2 p.m. start, has been moved to 3 p.m., and will be carried in Big 12 markets.

The next scheduled NETV broadcast is Saturday, May 1, when Texas A&M comes to Hawks Field with a first pitch at 2:05 p.m. The game will also be tape delayed and aired on College Sports TV on Sunday, May 2, at 4:30 p.m. (CT). NETV will also telecast the Huskers' game against Creighton at Rosenblatt Stadium on May 18.

Leading Off

- One of the strengths of the Huskers in 2004 has been the play of their defense. NU, which was ranked third nationally in defense in the initial NCAA rankings, is currently 16th nationally and third in the Big 12 with a .973 fielding percentage. The Huskers are still on pace to break the school mark of .971 set in 1994 and 1995.

The Huskers are a perfect 14-0 this season when they play errorless baseball and have a pair of stretches of at least 45 innings without an error, including a stretch of 63.1 innings - the longest stretch in over 20 years - last month.

- The Huskers have been perched in the national polls for the past 78 weeks, dating back to April of 2000.

- First baseman Curtis Ledbetter has been on a tear since returning to the lineup after a shoulder injury. The first baseman from Lawrence, Kan., is hitting .410 with five homers and 21 RBIs during his current team-high 14-game hit streak, raising his average of .324. Ledbetter was named the Big 12's co-Player of the Week on Tuesday as he hit .563 (9-for-16) with two homers and five RBIs in four games, including a four-hit day in Saturday's game at Missouri.

- Throughout 2004, the Huskers have gotten out to fast starts, outscoring opponents 45-17 in the opening inning of games and 121-46 over the first three innings.



Head Coach Mike Anderson

Northern Colorado, 1990
(73-28 (.723) - Second Season)

Mike Anderson is in his second season as Nebraska's head baseball coach, becoming the 23rd head coach in the program's history on June 21, 2002. Anderson has been associated with the NU program for the last decade, serving as an assistant from the fall of 1994 until his promotion to head coach in 2002.

Since joining the Nebraska staff in the fall of 1994, he has coached a total of 15 first-team all-conference honorees, while 19 of his former players have signed professional contracts. His most famous protegee is current Anaheim Angel All-Star Darin Erstad, who earned first-team All-America honors in 1995, when he was the first overall selection in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Seven Huskers have been tabbed first-team All-Americans under Anderson's tutelage, while four players – Erstad (1995), Harvey (1999), Dan Johnson (2001) and Jed Morris (2002) – have been finalists for various national player-of-the-year awards.

In 2003, Anderson guided Nebraska to a 47-18 record. After being picked fourth in the preseason by the league coaches, the Huskers won the Big 12 regular-season title with a 20-7 record, clinching the title on the final day of the season. He became the second first-year Husker coach to lead NU to a conference title and the first since 1929.

The Huskers led the Big 12 in hitting in each of Anderson's final four seasons as an assistant coach, including a .338 team average – the second highest in school history – in 1999. The Huskers led the Big 12 in seven offensive categories in 2002, including batting average (.315), hits (753), runs scored (543), doubles (154), RBIs (491), sacrifice hits (49) and sacrifice flies (46). In 2001, Anderson coached a Husker offense that ranked in the top-10 nationally in both team average (.334) and runs per game (9.20), while also finishing second nationally in total hits (787) and runs scored (607).

As the outfielders coach, Anderson has coached three All-Americans and seven all-conference selections, including Jeff Leise, who was a first-team All-American in 2002, while leading the Huskers to their second straight College World Series appearance.

Anderson's commitment to his student-athletes also extends to the classroom. Over the past nine years, the Huskers have placed 40 players on the first-team all-conference squad. Nebraska has had eight CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, including two in each of the past three seasons and 11 first-team academic all-district selections in the past seven seasons.

Before arriving in Lincoln in the fall of 1994, Anderson was the top assistant coach at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colo. He joined the Bears' staff after four years as a head coach with the Northern Colorado Lab School. From 1983 through 1986, Anderson was an outfielder at Northern Colorado for College Hall of Fame Coach Tom Petroff. Anderson was an eighth-round pick by the California Angels, spending four seasons with the Angels organization.

Anderson earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Northern Colorado in 1990. Anderson graduated from Eaton High School in Eaton, Colo., where he was a first-team All-Colorado shortstop for Coach Jim Danley.

Weekend Rotation vs. Texas



Zach Kroenke (pronounced KRON-neck-ee) • So. • LHP • 6-3 • 210 • Omaha, Neb.

Overview: Kroenke seeks his team-leading seventh win of the season in Friday's series opener...has made nine starts, going 6-0 with a 1.84 ERA, while striking out 55 in 63.2 innings...ranks in the top 10 in the league in ERA (third), opponent batting average (.202, third), wins (six, fifth), strikeouts (10th) and innings pitched (10th)...has been one of the league's top pitchers in league play, leading the Big 12 in ERA (1.16) and is tied for second in opponent batting average (.178)...has pitched at least five innings in all nine starts and is 4-0 with a 1.20 ERA over his last six starts, dating back to March 12...was named one of four finalists for the Husker Power Baseball Lifter of the Year on Tuesday. **Last Start:** Kroenke went eight solid innings against Missouri, allowing two runs on seven hits, but did not factor into the decision....allowed two runs in the second inning, including the first homer he allowed since March 6, but settled down and allowed only two base runners into scoring position over his final six frames. **2004:** Kroenke turned in a strong eight inning effort against Texas Tech, scattering seven hits and allowing one run in a 3-1 victory (4/9)...fanned nine and held the Red Raiders scoreless over his last eight innings of work...earned Big 12 honors against Kansas State, allowing one hit in a complete-game win over the Wildcats (4/2)...struck out seven and allowed one runner in scoring position as he faced one batter over the minimum...tossed the first individual one-hitter since Aaron Marsden tossed a one-hitter vs. Texas A&M in 2002...was solid against KU, holding the Jayhawks, who led the Big 12 in hitting with a .346 average, to five hits over six-plus innings in a 3-2 win (3/26)...was dominant against Boston College, allowing one run in a season-high 7.1 innings of work (3/19)...struck out eight and allowed one hit over the first 6.1 innings...turned in a strong performance against San Diego (3/12), allowing one run on six hits and taking a shutout into the seventh...allowed three runs on five hits in 5.1 innings in a no-decision against No. 22 Florida State (3/5)...scattered five hits and allowed four runs in seven-plus innings against Northwestern State on Feb. 27...struck out a career-high 11 Wildcats, including six straight, in 6.1 innings of work against Northwestern in the season opener (2/20). **2003 Highlights:** Was one of the Big 12's top freshman hurlers, going 6-2 with a 2.72 ERA in 59.2 innings...enjoyed nearly a 2-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio (35-to-19) while holding opponents to a .239 batting average... allowed three runs or less in 14 of his 15 appearances and combined on a pair of shutouts (Cal Poly and at Kansas)...shared Big 12 Pitcher-of-the-Week honors, going 2-0 in 11.2 innings in wins over Cal Poly and Oklahoma...tossed a complete-game six-hitter against Eastern Michigan in the 2003 NCAA Lincoln Regional...suffered losses against eventual CWS champion Rice (ranked No. 1 at the time) and CWS qualifier Texas (at Omaha's Rosenblatt Stadium). **Prior:** Ranked among the top 200 players in the nation according to Team One Baseball, Kroenke pitched for Northwest High School in Omaha...earned first-team All-Nebraska honors from the Lincoln Journal Star, going 4-5 with a 3.42 ERA, while leading the state with 90 strikeouts in 53 innings.

Last Season vs. Texas

Friday (Nebraska 3, Texas 2) - Aaron Marsden fired a complete-game six-hitter, leading No. 11 Nebraska to a 3-2 win over seventh-ranked Texas in the series opener. Marsden improved to 6-0 on the season, matching his career high with 11 strikeouts in a 119-pitch performance. The Huskers scored a run in the third on Alex Gordon's RBI single before taking a 3-0 lead two innings later on an RBI double by Joe Simokaitis and an RBI single by Matt Hopper.

Saturday (Nebraska 6, Texas 4) - Matt Hopper's three-run homer in the bottom of the seventh broke a 3-all tie as No. 11 Nebraska clinched the series win with a 6-4 victory. Hopper, who went 2-for-3 with three RBIs, and Alex Gordon, who hit a three-run homer off UT starter J.P. Howell, accounted for all six of NU's runs. Jason Burch earned the win in relief of Quinton Robertson, while Tim Schoeninger picked up his fifth save, firing 1.2 innings of scoreless relief. Robertson allowed three runs in 6.0 innings, but did not factor into the decision.

Sunday (Texas 10, Nebraska 4) - Matt Hopper became the Big 12's all-time home run leader, but No. 7 Texas salvaged the final game of the series with a 10-4 victory at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha. Hopper's homer, his 16th of the season, gave him 58 for his career, breaking the career Big 12 record he shared with Oklahoma's Casey Bookout. Daniel Bruce tied a season high with three hits and drove in a run, while Jake Mullinax went 1-for-4 with an RBI in the loss. John Grose also went 2-for-2 and scored a pair of runs.

Weekend Rotation vs. Texas



Phil Shirek (pronounced SHEAR-ik) Jr. • RHP • 6-3 • 210 • Minot, N.D.

Overview: Junior who has been in the Huskers' weekend rotation for most of the 2004 campaign and makes his sixth start of the season on Saturday...is 5-0 with a 2.95 ERA, while holding foes to a .258 average...ranks ninth in the Big 12 in ERA and 10th in the league in victories...has allowed five extra base hits in 36.2 innings of work. **Last Outing:** Shirek made his first relief appearance since March 6 against Missouri last Saturday, allowing three runs (two earned) on five hits in three innings against Missouri. **2004 Highlights:** Made his last start against Texas Tech on April 10, lasting only three innings in a no-decision vs. Texas Tech...allowed five runs on three hits but matched his career high with four walks...went five-plus innings in a 4-0 shutout of Kansas State (4/3)...allowed just three hits in helping the Huskers to a fourth straight shutout...had one of the best outings of his career in a complete-game win against Kansas (3/28)...struck out a career-best 10 Jayhawks and scattered seven hits in a game that was shortened to seven innings because of the Big 12 run-rule...scattered four hits and allowed one run over six innings in a 10-1 win over Boston College (3/21)...struck out three Eagles and allowed one hit in his final three innings...pitched well in the series finale at San Diego State in PETCO Park, allowing two runs on six hits in 6.2 innings in his first start of the season (3/14)...tossed 4.2 innings of relief vs. West Virginia to pick up the win (3/7)...faced one over the minimum through his first four innings against the Mountaineers...also made scoreless relief outings vs. No. 15 North Carolina and Kent State...pitched for Harwich in the Cape Cod League, going 0-1 with a 1.67 ERA in 10 outings last summer. **2003 Highlights:** Compiled a 5-3 record with a 3.90 ERA in 18 appearances, including 10 starts...held opponents to a .227 average in 62.1 innings of work...earned his first career Big 12 win, allowing one run on four hits in seven innings against Oklahoma State on May 12, helping the Huskers to a series sweep over the Cowboys...was dominant in a win over Creighton on April 29, tossing eight shutout innings and allowing one runner to reach scoring position. He struck out two and retired 13 of the first 14 batters he faced...pitched at least five innings in five of his 10 starts in 2003. **2002 Highlights:** Tabbed a freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball, going 4-2 with a 3.45 ERA in 18 appearances. **Prior:** NU's first signee from North Dakota since current Anaheim Angels All-Star Darin Erstad...Gatorade Circle of Champions Player of the Year in the state of North Dakota in both baseball and football as a high school senior...broke the American Legion national tournament record with 20 strikeouts in a regional game, eclipsing the national tournament record held by former Baltimore Orioles great Dave McNally...younger brother Charlie signed a National Letter-of-Intent with NU last November.

Scouting Texas

Head Coach Augie Garrido (316-167-1 in eight seasons at Texas; 1,469-691-8 overall in 36 seasons) has Texas at the top of the national polls with a 39-5 mark entering the weekend. The only team to defeat Texas more than once in 2004 is Stanford, which took 2-of-3 from the Longhorns at Sunken Diamond in February. While Texas is on top of all four national polls, UT is second in the Big 12 with a 11-3 mark, trailing Oklahoma by one-half game. Texas took 2-of-3 from the Sooners in Norman last month.

The strength of the Longhorns is their pitching staff, which leads the nation with a 2.34 team ERA, including a league-high nine shutouts. Junior left-hander J.P. Howell paces Texas with an 8-1 record and a 1.83 ERA, while fanning a conference-high 95 batters in 73.2 innings. In addition, Sam LeCure (6-0, 2.22 ERA) and Justin Simmons (8-1, 3.67 ERA) join Howell in anchoring the UT rotation. All-American Huston Street (4-1, 4 SV, 1.48 ERA) and J. Brant Cox (3-1, 5 SV, 1.03 ERA) provide a potent 1-2 punch in the bullpen.

Offensively, Texas has a balanced offensive unit, with three different players driving in at least 30 runs. J.D. Reininger and Taylor Teagarden share the team lead with 31 RBIs, while Drew Stubbs and Seth Johnson both are tied with five homers. The Longhorns excel at the little things, leading the Big 12 in both sacrifices (65) and stolen bases (94).

Nebraska leads the all-time series, 17-11, in a season that dates back to 1954, and has won the regular-season series in each of the past five years. In 2003, NU went 2-1, winning twice at Hawks Field while the Longhorns won the finale, 10-4, in Omaha last April. The teams have met only once in the postseason, with Texas winning the 2002 Big 12 Tournament title game by a 9-6 count in 10 innings.

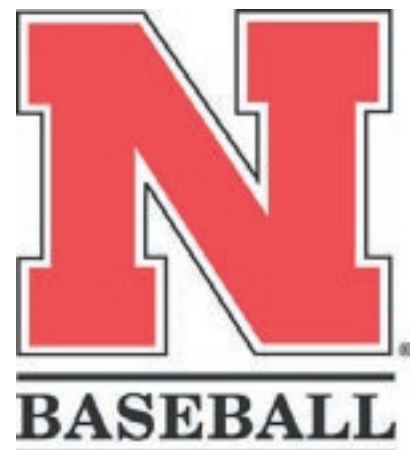

Welcome to Hawks Field at Haymarket Park

The 2002 season marked the debut of the Huskers' new home – Hawks Field at Haymarket Park. The field is named in memory of Myrna Hawks, as the Hawks family was one of the major benefactors in the Haymarket Park project.

In March of 2000, Howard and Myrna Hawks guaranteed the unfunded portion of UNL's \$10.6 million commitment to the baseball/softball complex, which enabled the University to move forward in a joint venture with the City of Lincoln and NEBCO, Inc., the owners of the Lincoln Saltdogs in the Northern League. The University retained the right to name the field and on Feb. 23, 2002, the University of Nebraska Board of Regents approved the name of Hawks Field. It was formally dedicated in pregame ceremonies against Kansas on April 28, 2002. The ballpark includes 4,500 chair-back seats, 16 suites, a Diamond View Lounge and a Sub-Air system that allows the field to grow grass nearly year-round. The park is one of only three fields in the country that uses this state-of-the-art heating system (Invesco Field at Mile High and Safeco Field are the others). Other highlights of the complex include a 1,400-square foot clubhouse for the Husker baseball program, a video board/scoreboard in right center field, the Buck Beltzer Playground for kids down the right field line and numerous restrooms and concession stands.

Hawks Field, as well as the adjacent Bowlin Stadium – the 2,500-seat softball stadium which opened in the fall of 2001 – are both located inside Haymarket Park, a 32-acre complex that includes both stadiums as well as the plaza area and 2,000 parking stalls. The 2002 season marked the first time since World War II that the Huskers did not play at the former sight of Buck Beltzer Stadium on the Nebraska campus.

Husker Baseball Notes vs. Texas

- Sunday's win over Missouri marked the 100th game under Head Coach Mike Anderson at NU, and the Huskers celebrated the occasion by pulling out a dramatic 11-10 win over the Tigers. Anderson's record at the 100-game mark was 73-27, which is the second best mark at that point in school history.

- Sophomore Alex Gordon looks to continue one conference streak while ending another drought at the same time. Gordon, who is second in the Big 12 with 13 homers, is one off the league lead of 14 by Kansas' Travis Metcalf. A Husker has led the Big 12 in homers in each of the past four seasons, dating back to the 2000 season (Matt Hopper and Dan Johnson, 2000; Dan Johnson, 2001; Jed Morris, 2002; Matt Hopper, 2003).

While Gordon adds his legacy to an impressive list of Husker sluggers, he also looks to become the first Husker third baseman to earn first-team all-conference accolades since Derek Dukart in 1994. Gordon's performance not only potentially puts him among the favorites for league honors, but also compares very favorably to NU's last two Big 12 Players of the Year (Jed Morris in 2002 and Matt Hopper last season).

This is the second time that Bruce has been nominated and the first for both Becker and Sillman.

- The Nebraska baseball team joined the men's basketball, track and cross country teams as the four finalists for the Herman Award. The honor is presented to the men's and women's teams with the highest GPA over the previous two semesters. It marked the second straight season that the Husker baseball team has been a finalist for the campus award (won by the cross country team on Sunday).

- The Huskers have scored five or more runs in an inning nine times in 2004, spanning a total of eight games. The eight runs scored against Missouri on Sunday equaled the highest single inning total in 2004 (also vs. Northwestern on Feb. 20) and was the most in an inning since scoring nine runs in the fifth inning vs. Texas-Pan American on April 23, 2003. NU is 8-0 when scoring five or more runs in an inning this season.

- Husker Power announced Tuesday the four finalists for the 2004 Husker Power Baseball Lifter of the Year. Pitchers Zach Kroenke and Phil Shirek join third baseman Alex Gordon and second baseman Jake Mullinax as the four finalists. The award will be announced before the the Huskers' game against Texas A&M on Sunday, May 2.

Last Time Out

The Huskers saw their six-game winning streak over Creighton snapped in a 6-4 Bluejay win at Hawks Field. The CU win evens the season series at one game each heading into the finale at Omaha's Rosenblatt Stadium on May 18.

Tuesday (Creighton 6, Nebraska 4) – Creighton scored a pair of runs in the top of the sixth to break a 3-all tie, as the Bluejays downed No. 16 Nebraska, 6-4, in front of 5,745 at Hawks Field on Tuesday. Nebraska (26-10) overcame a 3-1 deficit on Curtis Ledbetter's two-run double in the fifth, but Creighton (20-14) regained momentum by scoring twice in the sixth and adding an insurance run in the seventh after Nebraska closed to within 5-4 on Colin Shockey's RBI double. Ledbetter extended his hitting streak to 14 games and drove in two runs, while Shockey, Alex Gordon and Jake Mullinax all had two hits apiece in a losing effort. Tim Schoeninger took the loss, as the Huskers used seven pitchers in defeat.

Huskers vs. No. 1

Nebraska's series against Texas this weekend marks the Huskers' first game against the nation's top-ranked team since the Huskers faced Rice on March 18, 2001, a 4-1 Rice victory. Sophomore Zach Kroenke was NU's starter that evening, allowing three runs in his first collegiate start.

The last time that Nebraska knocked off a No. 1 team came against Texas A&M on May 22, 1999, an 8-7 Husker victory at the Big 12 Tournament.

Aces High

After playing a significant role in NU's Big 12 title run last season, sophomore left-hander Zach Kroenke has become the ace of the 2004 staff. The Omaha Northwest product has followed in the footsteps of some of the best pitchers in school history, going 6-0 with a 1.84 ERA after his first nine starts. Kroenke's numbers are remarkably similar to former Big 12 Pitchers of the Year Shane Komine (2000-01) and Aaron Marsden (2003). Kroenke is 12-2 with a 2.26 ERA during his Husker career and has won nine straight decisions dating back to last April 30.

Shockey Does it All

After three years of seeing Jeff Leise patrol center field, junior college transfer Colin Shockey has made the transition look seamless this spring. While both are rather diminutive (Shockey - 5-10, 170; Leise - 5-10, 165), both have some pop in their bats. Leise had seven homers as a senior last spring, while Shockey is tied for third on the squad with eight doubles. Shockey, who is second on the team with six stolen bases, is fourth in the Big 12 with a .471 on-base percentage, bolstered by a team-high 14 hit-by-pitches.

Shockey comes from a baseball background, as his father, Curt, played at Kansas State in the early 1970s and is a longtime high school coach. Colin also brings versatility to the Huskers with his ability to play every position except catcher. On the mound, he has made three relief appearances, allowing one run in 3.1 innings of work. Shockey picked up the win in Sunday's series finale, becoming the first Husker position player to earn a win since Jarod Bearinger in 1997. While Bearinger was primarily a pitcher, making eight starts in the field, Shockey has been entrenched in center field all spring and has not committed an error in 75 chances.

Gordon Stacks Up at Third

One of the reasons for the Huskers' strong first half start has been the play of third baseman Alex Gordon. The sophomore from Lincoln has been a steady force in the middle of the Husker lineup, leading the Big Red in nearly every offensive category. Gordon, who was named to the Golden Spikes Watch List last week, also paces NU in multi-hit games (17) and multi-RBI efforts (15) and has been walked a team-high 29 times. He has also tied Curtis Ledbetter for the team lead with eight game-winning RBIs in 2004.

Ledbetter on a Tear

Junior first baseman Curtis Ledbetter has been nearly unstoppable since returning to the lineup on March 31. The 6-3, 220-pound junior first baseman is hitting .410 with all five of his homers and 21 RBIs over the last 14 games, raising his season totals to .324-5-38. On Tuesday, Ledbetter was named the Big 12 Co-Player of the Week after hitting .563 with two homers, three doubles and five RBIs in four games last week. He went 8-for-12 at Missouri last weekend, including a four-hit game in Saturday's

loss. Ledbetter, who has driven in at least one run in 13 of his last 14 games, is tied with Alex Gordon for the team lead with eight game-winning RBIs.

Gordon Honored Twice

Gordon was named to Baseball America's mid-season All-America team earlier this month. The Lincoln native was one of 17 sophomores chosen for the team, which includes one starter at each position, one utility player and six pitchers (five starters and a reliever). Baseball America lists a team for each of the four classes.

He was also honored last Wednesday, as one of 30 players selected to the Golden Spikes Watch List. The Golden Spikes Award has been presented annually by USA Baseball since 1978 to the player who exhibits exceptional athletic ability and exemplary sportsmanship. Gordon is one of four Big 12 players on the 30-player watch list, joining Texas' pitching duo of J.P. Howell and Huston Street and Oklahoma State catcher Jason Jaramillo.

Grose Named to Johnny Bench Watch List

John Grose has been named to the Johnny Bench Watch List. The senior from Henderson, Nev., is a three-year starter for the Huskers and a career .300 hitter. Grose has thrown out nearly 40 percent of would-be base stealers this spring, as Nebraska has allowed only 22 stolen bases. Grose is one of 45 candidates on the initial Watch List. The list will be trimmed to 10 semifinalists on May 10, with the winner being named in early June.

Thou Shall Not Steal on Husker Catchers

Nebraska's catching duo of John Grose and Chad Steele have combined to throw out 19 of 41 would-be base stealers this season. Grose, who was limited by an elbow injury last spring, has thrown out 40 percent of runners in 20 attempts, while Steele has thrown out 55 percent in 20 attempts. The 22 stolen bases given up by NU is the second-lowest total in the Big 12.

Second (Base) to None

With the graduation of Big 12 Player of the Year Matt Hopper, one of the questions entering 2004 was who would supply some of Hopper's home run power. Second baseman Jake Mullinax has become of NU's long ball hitters in 2004. The senior co-captain from Hesperia, Calif., is second on the team with six homers - including four in conference play. Mullinax, who also ranks among the Big 12 leaders with a .366 average and 12 sacrifices, has driven in a team-high 15 runs in Big 12 action.

Pitchers Set Big 12 Shutout Streak Mark

Earlier this month, the Nebraska pitching staff established a record with 43.1 scoreless innings. The record, which included 42 complete innings and parts of two others, broke the Big 12 record of 41 set by Texas in 2002.

In all, the Husker pitchers tossed a pair of one-hitters, a three-hitter and a five-hitter before Kansas

State scored a run in the fourth inning of NU's win on April 4, marking the first run scored by a Husker opponent since March 28. Oklahoma held the Big Eight record with 31 straight scoreless innings in 1971, while Arizona State holds the NCAA mark with 64 straight scoreless innings back in 1972.

Ouch!

Husker hitters have been hit at an alarming rate in 2004, getting plunked an amazing 70 times in the first 36 contests. In all, Nebraska has been hit by three or more pitches 16 times, including a season-high six against UW-Milwaukee on March 30. Colin Shockey leads the Huskers with 14 HBPs, while Daniel Bruce has been hit 12 times, increasing his school record to 54 in 149 career games. At the current rate, NU's projected 56-game regular-season total of 109 would set a school and Big 12 record (99 in 2002) and threaten Nevada's NCAA mark of 125 set in 1997.

Stingy Becker Cuts Out Inheritance

Junior left-hander Jeremy Becker has made a name for himself as one of the Big 12's best situational relievers. While he does not have a save, the 5-11, 215-pounder from Scottsbluff has played a major role in the Huskers' success this spring. Becker owns a 3.27 ERA in a team-high 15 appearances and is holding hitters to a .205 average, but the most significant number that relates to Becker is that he has allowed only one of 19 inherited runners to score. The academic All-America candidate went nearly an entire year (25 runners over his last 21 appearances) without allowing an inherited runner to score.

Against Kansas State on April 3, Becker entered the game in the sixth inning with NU clinging to a 3-0 lead and KSU loading the bases with no outs. Becker came out of the bullpen to fan both batters he faced. In last Tuesday's win against No. 10 Wichita State, Becker faced a bases-loaded situation, but got out of the jam to preserve the Husker lead.

Fastest to 50

NU Head Coach Mike Anderson became the quickest Husker coach to win 50 games, accomplishing the feat in just 68 games. Only three coaches in school history have ever won 50 games, but that shouldn't be that surprising since the Huskers have only had four coaches (including Anderson) since 1947.

The Hottest Ticket in Town: Husker Baseball

In the last five years, the increased interest in the Nebraska baseball program has resulted in record-shattering ticket sales. The Huskers have broken season ticket marks in each of the past three years and is already on another record-setting pace in 2004.

Junior outfielder Daniel Bruce was voted as having the best defensive arm in the Big 12 in a poll of conference coaches for Baseball America. The Omaha native had a team-high six outfield assists in 2003, and 11 outfield assists in his three seasons as a Husker. Bruce, who could see time in both center and right field, batted .311 with six homers and 33 RBIs as a sophomore.

Huskers Honored for Academic Work

A total of 15 Husker baseball players were honored earlier this month with selection to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll. The baseball players were among 286 Husker student-athletes who were recognized for their success in the classroom.

Huskers Success Not Limited to Diamond

Nebraska has not only enjoyed an unprecedented run of success on the playing field, but has also shined in the classroom as well.

- Nebraska has had five first-team CoSIDA Academic All-Americans since 1999, including Jeff Leise, who was the Academic All-American of the Year in 2002 and 2003.

- Leise and Aaron Marsden were both chosen as first-team CoSIDA All-Americans in 2003. Nebraska was the only school with two first-teamers on the 11-member squad encompassing all of Division I baseball.
