## Huskers Head to Big 12 Tournament in Arlington

The Nebraska baseball team ventures to Arlington, Texas, this week for the Phillips 66 Big 12 baseball tournament. The four-day, extravaganza begins Wednesday, May 26, and runs until Sunday, May 30 in newly named Amerquest Field (formerly the Ballpark in Arlington).

All of Nebraska's games will be carried on the Pinnacle Sports Network with Jim Rose and Gary Sharp calling all of the action. In addition, fans who aren't in attendance can watch live on the Internet on HuskersNside, as both Wednesday and Thursday's games will be carried live on the site.

The Huskers finished the regular season with a 35-21 mark, placing eighth in the Big 12 with an 11-16 mark, the first time that Nebraska hasn't finished first or second in the league since 1999. The Huskers have now qualified for each of the past six Big 12 postseason events dating back to 1999.

The Huskers open tournament action Wednesday evening, as they take on regular-season champion Texas in a matchup of the last five Big 12 tournament champions (NU, 1999-2001; Texas 2002-03). The Longhorns, who were ranked as high as second in the national polls, took 2-of-3 from No. 9 Texas A&M last weekend to earn their second regular-season title in three years.

At 48-11 and 19-7 in the league, Texas is looking to lock up one of the eight national seeds for the upcoming NCAA tournament, while the Huskers need a strong effort this week to keep their hopes for a sixth-straight NCAA regional berth alive.

While a matchup between the No. 1 and No. 8 seeds may seem like a mismatch, history shows that the tourney opener can bring unexpected results. Since the tournament went to the current eight-team format in 1999, the top-seeded team has gone only 3-2 against the No. 8 seed, with Oklahoma (1999) and Texas A&M (2002) pulling first-round surprises. Two years ago, the Aggies defeated Texas, 8-4, handing UT ace Justin Simmons his only blemish in a 16-1 year.

Following Wednesday's tournament opener, Nebraska will face either fourth-seeded Oklahoma

State (33-22, 15-11 Big 12) or fifth-seeded Texas A&M (39-17, 17-12) on Thursday. A win on Wednesday means that NU will play Thursday evening at 8 p.m., while a loss sends NU to an elimination game against the Cowboys or Aggies Thursday morning at 1 p.m.

The other half of the bracket includes Big 12 runner-up Oklahoma State, Texas Tech (No. 3), Baylor (No. 6) and Missouri (No. 7). The two brackets will battle in a double-elimination tournament with the winners squaring off Sunday afternoon in the title game with the league's automatic NCAA berth on the line.

The Huskers will fly out of Omaha on Monday afternoon (depart Lincoln at Noon) and practice Tuesday at 1 p.m. at Amerquest Field, following a press conference slated 11:30 a.m. at the ballpark.

**Head Coach Mike Anderson**  
Northern Colorado, 1990  
(82-39 (.678) - Second Season)

Mike Anderson is his second season as Nebraska's head baseball coach, becoming the 23rd head coach in the program's history on June 21, 2002. Anderson has been associated with the NU program for the last decade, serving as an assistant from the fall of 1994 until his promotion to head coach in 2002.

Since joining the Nebraska staff in the fall of 1994, he has coached a total of 15 first-team all-conference honorees, while 19 of his former players have signed professional contracts. His most famous protegee is current Anaheim Angel All-Star Darin Erstad, who earned first-team All-America honors in 1995, when he was the first overall selection in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Seven Huskers have been tabbed first-team All-Americans under Anderson's tutelage, while four players – Erstad (1995), Harvey (1999), Dan Johnson (2001) and Jed Morris (2002) – have been finalists for various national player-of-the-year awards.

In 2003, Anderson guided Nebraska to a 47-18 record. After being picked fourth in the preseason by the league coaches, the Huskers won the Big 12 regular-season title with a 20-7 record, clinching the title on the final day of the season. He became the second first-year Husker coach to lead NU to a conference title and the first since 1929.

The Huskers led the Big 12 in hitting in each of Anderson's final four seasons as an assistant coach, including a .338 team average – the second highest in school history – in 1999. The Huskers led the Big 12 in seven offensive categories in 2002, including batting average (.315), hits (753), runs scored (543), doubles (154), RBIs (491), sacrifice hits (49) and sacrifice flies (46). In 2001, Anderson coached a Husker offense that ranked in the top-10 nationally in both team average (.334) and runs per game (9.20), while also finishing second nationally in hits (787) and runs scored (607).

As the outfielders coach, Anderson has coached three All-Americans and seven all-conference selections, including Jeff Leise, who was a first-team All-American in 2002, while leading the Huskers to their second straight College World Series appearance.

Anderson's commitment to his student-athletes also extends to the classroom. Over the past nine years, the Huskers have placed 40 players on the first-team all-conference squad. Nebraska has had eight CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, including two in each of the past three seasons and 11 first-team academic all-district selections in the past seven seasons.

Before arriving in Lincoln in the fall of 1994, Anderson was the top assistant coach at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colo. He joined the Bears' staff after four years as a head coach with the Northern Colorado Lab School. From 1983 through 1986, Anderson was an outfielder at Northern Colorado for College Hall of Fame Coach Tom Petroff. Anderson was an eighth-round pick by the California Angels, spending four seasons with the Angels organization.

Anderson earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Northern Colorado in 1990. Anderson graduated from Eaton High School in Eaton, Colo., where he was a first-team All-Colorado shortstop for Coach Jim Danley.

## Big 12 Tournament: Game 1 Starter vs. Texas



**Justin Pekarek (pronounced puh-CAR-eck) Sr. • LHP • 6-3 • 220 • Staplehurst, Neb.**

**Overview:** Fifth-year senior who has been the Huskers' hottest pitcher during the past month...comes into Wednesday's

Big 12 Tournament opener against Texas with a 7-1 record and a 3.19 ERA in 67.2 innings of work....ranks ninth in the Big 12 in wins and 10th in ERA, while posting a 4.5-to-1

strikeout-to-walk ratio...has not allowed a run since April 17, spanning 27 innings of work...needs 2/3 of an inning to break the school record for most consecutive scoreless innings (Jamie Rodrigue, 2000; Phil Harrison, 1984)...three of his seven wins have come against ranked opponents, including No. 1 Texas in Austin, No. 15 North Carolina and No. 21 Oklahoma State in Stillwater...team captain who earned a degree in business administration earlier this month...hails from Staplehurst, Neb. (population of less than 300). **Last Appearance:** Pekarek tossed three innings of no-hit ball in relief against No. 18 Oklahoma on Sunday, coming into the game in the fifth and fanning two in a 2-1 loss to the Sooners. **2004:** Turned in his best start in front of 10,261 fans and a state-wide television audience at Omaha's Rosenblatt Stadium against Creighton in his last start, allowing two hits and fanning a career-high nine Bluejays over a career-long 7.0 innings...tossed 2.2 shutout innings of relief, fanning three and allowing three hits in a no-decision at Baylor (5/15)...earned his second Big 12 win by firing 4.1 scoreless innings in the series finale at No. 21 Oklahoma State (5/10)...scattered four hits after coming into the game in the fifth with a runner in scoring position and got the Huskers out of the jam with the score tied at two....dominant in relief against No. 10 Texas A&M, throwing five shutout innings with four strikeouts in a 4-2 loss to the Aggies (5/1)...notched his first career Big 12 win against No. 1 Texas on April 25, firing three shutout innings against the Longhorns, as Nebraska rallied for a 4-3 win...suffered his only loss to Texas Tech on April 11, as he struck out six over 3.2 innings, but allowed five unearned runs in a 10-3 loss to the Red Raiders...turned in the finest outing of his career against UIW-Milwaukee, tossing six innings of no-hit ball in NU's 10-0 win (3/30)...struck out a career-high seven Panthers and retired the final 16 batters he faced...left after six innings (67 pitches) as he was scheduled to start five days later against Kansas State...earned the win at Creighton on March 23, fanning six in a career-best 6.1 innings of work...retired 12 straight Bluejays at one point, while setting personal bests in innings and matching his strikeout high as a Husker...turned in one of the best outings of his career against No. 15 North Carolina on Feb. 29, allowing four runs on six hits in 5.1 innings...allowed one base runner between the second and fifth innings, retiring 14 of 15 Tar Heels in one stretch. **Prior to 2004:** Went 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA in nine appearances in 2003, earning wins against South Dakota (4/23/03) and Western Illinois (4/2/03)...missed all of the 2002 season after elbow surgery...a titanium screw was placed in the elbow by internationally renowned surgeon Dr. James Andrews...made three appearances as a redshirt freshman in 2001, including one in the College World Series against Tulane, where he took the loss against the Green Wave.

## Overview: Kroenke looks for his eighth win of the season on Thursday against Oklahoma

State or Texas A&M in the second round of the Big 12 Tournament...will make team-high 15th start of the season, a total that will tie him for eighth on NU's single-season list...is 7-4 with 69 strikeouts and a 3.07 ERA in a team-best 96.2 innings...ranks in the top 10 in the league in ERA (eighth), opponent batting average (.239, ninth), complete games (two, fourth), innings (eighth) and average per start (6.90 innings, fourth)...has pitched at least five innings in 13 of his 14 starts and has allowed two runs or less in eight of his last 11 outings dating back to March 12...was 4-4 with a 3.38 ERA in a team-best 64 innings during the conference season...will spend the upcoming summer pitching in the Cape Cod League for Harwich. **Last Start:** Kroenke struggled with his control, walking a season-high four batters, to take the loss against No. 18 Oklahoma on Friday...allowed three runs in the first two innings but only allowed one more earned run, as he pitched into the eighth...scattered nine hits and fanned three in 121 pitches. **2004:** Kroenke pitched well, but was hurt by NU's lack of offensive production in a 2-1 loss at Baylor on May 14...allowed two runs on nine hits while striking out four over seven innings, but left with a 2-0 deficit...took the loss at OSU, allowing career highs in hits (10) and runs (seven) over 6.1 innings...yielded two homers - the first time he allowed more than one homer in any appearance- against the Cowboys...tossed his second complete game of the year, allowing three hits in a 4-1 victory over No. 10 Texas A&M (4/30)...retired the first 13 hitters and fanned four in a 108-pitch gem...suffered his first loss in over a year, allowing six runs in just 3.1 innings at No. 1 Texas (4/23)...went eight solid innings against Missouri, allowing two runs on seven hits, but did not factor into the decision...allowed two runs in the second then allowed only two base runners in his final six frames...turned in a strong eight innings against Texas Tech, scattering seven hits and allowing one run in a 3-1 victory (4/9)...fanned nine and held the Red Raiders scoreless over his last seven innings...earned Big 12 honors against Kansas State, allowing one hit in a complete-game win over the Wildcats (4/2)...struck out seven and allowed one runner in scoring position as he faced one batter over the minimum...tossed the first individual one-hitter since Aaron Marsden tossed a one-hitter vs. Texas A&M in 2002...was solid against KU, holding the Jayhawks, who led the Big 12 in hitting with a .346 average, to five hits over six-plus innings in a 3-2 win (3/26)...dominated Boston College, allowing one run in 7.1 innings (3/19)...struck out eight and allowed one hit over the first 6.1 innings...struck out a career-high 11 over 6.1 innings of work against Northwestern in the season opener (2/20). **2003:** Was one of the Big 12's top freshman hurlers, going 6-2 with a 2.72 ERA in 59.2 innings...enjoyed nearly a 2-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio (35-to-19) while holding opponents to a .239 batting average...allowed three runs or less in 14 of his 15 appearances and combined on a pair of shutouts (Cal Poly and at Kansas)...shared Big 12 Pitcher-of-the-Week honors, going 2-0 in 11.2 innings in wins over Cal Poly and Oklahoma...tossed a complete-game six-hitter against Eastern Michigan in the 2003 NCAA Lincoln Regional...suffered losses against eventual CWS champion and No. 1 Rice and CWS qualifier Texas (at Rosenblatt Stadium). **Prior:** Ranked among the top 200 players in the nation according to Team One Baseball, Kroenke pitched for Northwest High School in Omaha...earned first-team All-Nebraska honors from the Lincoln Journal Star, going 4-5 with a 3.42 ERA, while leading the state with 90 strikeouts in 53 innings.

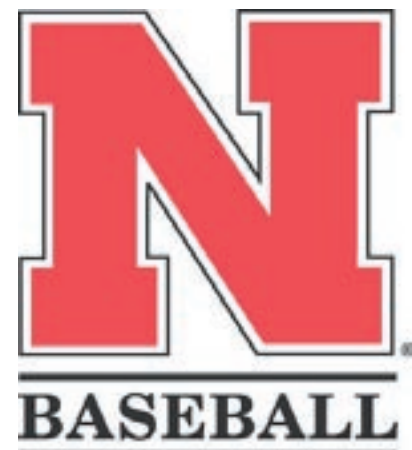

### Welcome to Hawks Field at Haymarket Park

The 2002 season marked the debut of the Huskers' new home – Hawks Field at Haymarket Park. The field is named in memory of Myrna Hawks, as the Hawks family was one of the major benefactors in the Haymarket Park project.

In March of 2000, Howard and Myrna Hawks guaranteed the unfunded portion of UNL's \$10.6 million commitment to the baseball/softball complex, which enabled the University to move forward in a joint venture with the City of Lincoln and NEBCO, Inc., the owners of the Lincoln Saltdogs in the Northern League. The University retained the right to name the field and on Feb. 23, 2002, the University of Nebraska Board of Regents approved the name of Hawks Field. It was formally dedicated in pregame ceremonies against Kansas on April 28, 2002. The ballpark includes 4,500 chair-back seats, 16 suites, a Diamond View Lounge and a Sub-Air system that allows the field to grow grass nearly year-round. The park is one of only three fields in the country that uses this state-of-the-art heating system (Invesco Field at Mile High and Safeco Field are the others). Other highlights of the complex include a 1,400-square foot clubhouse for the Husker baseball program, a video board/scoreboard in right center field, the Buck Beltzer Playground for kids down the right field line and numerous restrooms and concession stands.

Hawks Field, as well as the adjacent Bowlin Stadium – the 2,500-seat softball stadium which opened in the fall of 2001 – are both located inside Haymarket Park, a 32-acre complex that includes both stadiums as well as the plaza area and 2,000 parking stalls. The 2002 season marked the first time since World War II that the Huskers did not play at the former sight of Buck Beltzer Stadium on the Nebraska campus.

# Scouting Texas

Head Coach Augie Garrido (325-173-1 in eight seasons at Texas; 1,478-697-8 overall in 36 seasons) leads Texas into the Big 12 Tournament as the No. 1 seed after guiding the Longhorns to the Big 12 regular-season title with a 19-7 league mark and 48-11 overall record. Texas won 2-of-3 from No. 9 Texas A&M over the weekend, but lost its final regular-season game with a 7-1 setback to the Aggies in College Station on Sunday. UT actually lost three of its last five contests after getting shut out in both games of a doubleheader against North Carolina State in Austin on May 15.

The Longhorns took two of three games from the Huskers in Austin April 23-25, but Nebraska escaped with a 4-3 win in the finale on Sunday. Since beating NU 4-2 on April 24, Texas is just 7-6 in its last 13 games and has been shut out on three occasions, while managing just one run in two other contests.

While the Longhorn bats have been inconsistent down the stretch, the Texas pitching staff continues to lead the Big 12 and rank among the best in the nation with a 2.51 ERA. Opponents are hitting just .213 against the Longhorns. Texas has notched 10 shutouts, thanks in part to a team strikeout-to-walk ratio of 2.8-to-1. Junior left-hander J.P. Howell has been UT's ace throughout the season, leading Big 12 starters in wins (12-2), ERA (1.94), strikeouts (130 in 106.2 innings) and opponent batting average (.171). All-American Huston Street (4-1, 10 SV, 1.60 ERA) and J. Brent Cox (4-1, 5 SV, 1.65 ERA) lead a dominant Texas bullpen that also includes Buck Cody (1-1, 2 SV, 1.50 ERA). All nine of UT's pitchers with more than three appearances own ERA's under 4.00, while seven carry sub-3.00 ERA's.

Offensively, Carson Kainer has been UT's most consistent hitter, batting .364 with an on-base percentage of .423. Kainer also leads the Longhorns with a .354 average against Big 12 opponents. Curtis Thigpen is hitting .358 on the year with a team-best .466 on-base percentage to go along with his team-high 44 runs scored and team-best 12 doubles. He has added four homers and 37 RBIs, as the only other Longhorn batting over .300 on the year. Drew Stubbs enters the Big 12 Tournament hitting .297 with five homers and 29 RBIs, while adding a team-high 23 stolen bases in 27 attempts. Stubbs has also struck out a team-high 58 times. Seth Johnston is hitting .294 and leads UT with six home runs, while matching Taylor Teagarden for the team lead with 39 RBIs. Johnston has added 14 stolen bases in 23 attempts. As a team, the Longhorns rank ninth in the Big 12 in team batting.

Nebraska leads the all-time series, 18-13, in a series that dates back to 1954, but lost the 2004 regular-season series against Texas for the first time in six years. In 2003, NU went 2-1, winning twice at Hawks Field while the Longhorns won the finale, 10-4, in Omaha last April. The teams have met only once in the postseason, with Texas winning the 2002 Big 12 Tournament title game by a 9-6 count at Arlington in 10 innings.

In addition to broadcasting Husker games, Pinnacle Sports also provides Sports Nightly, a daily, live call-in show focusing on NU athletics and other area sports that runs from 6 to 8 p.m. (central) on Pinnacle's statewide network.

### Huskers Look for Fourth Big 12 Tourney Title

Nebraska makes its sixth consecutive appearance in the Big 12 Tournament in Arlington this week and looks to continue its run of success.

The Huskers are 18-4 in the Big 12 tournament, taking home three straight titles from 1999 to 2001 and finishing second two years ago in Arlington. The Huskers became the first team to win three tournament titles and also became the first league team to win the regular-season and tournament titles in the same season, when they captured both titles in 2001.

# Husker Baseball Notes (Big 12 Tournament)

## Pekarek Chases History

After not being on Nebraska's 25-man NCAA roster a year ago, fifth-year senior Justin Pekarek takes the hill in Nebraska's Big 12 Tournament opener against No. 2 Texas Wednesday night. Pekarek, who is 7-1 with a 3.19 ERA, has allowed just 14 hits - and just one for extra bases - over his last seven appearances. With 27 consecutive scoreless innings, Pekarek is on the doorstep of breaking the school mark for consecutive shutout innings.

## A Rare 1-0 Gem

Nebraska picked up its sixth shutout of the season in emphatic fashion, outlasting No. 18 Oklahoma, 1-0, in 11 innings. While the Huskers have pitched six shutouts, good for second in the Big 12, Saturday's win marked NU's first 1-0 win since a victory at Louisville on Feb. 27, 1998. At home, the feat was an even more rare, as NU had not spun a 1-0 blanking at home in 24 years - April 26, 1980, in a 1-0 win over Missouri.

## 56 and Counting

With Saturday's shutout, the Huskers not only snapped OU's streak of scoring at least one run in 216 straight games, but regained the lead for the longest time without a shutout in the Big 12. Nebraska, which had a streak of 330 consecutive games with a run - the fourth longest streak in NCAA history - snapped in the 2003 regional title game, was the only Big 12 team not shut out during the 2004 regular season.

## Huskers Play 11th Road Game in Pro Ballpark

Tuesday's visit to Rosenblatt Stadium marks the Huskers' 11th road game at a AAA or Major League ballpark this spring. Nebraska is 7-3 on the year, posting a 3-0 mark at Isotopes Park (AAA Albuquerque Isotopes), a 1-2 record at the Metrodome (Minnesota Twins), a 2-1 record at Petco Park (San Diego Padres) and a 1-0 record at Rosenblatt Stadium (AAA Omaha Royals). In addition, the Huskers' ballpark - Hawks Field at Haymarket Park - hosted the Omaha Royals in their series opener with Fresno earlier this month.

## Leading Off:

- Last week marked the first time in 82 weeks that the Huskers were not ranked in any of the three major baseball polls (Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America or Sports Weekly/ESPN Coaches) since April of 2000.

- The lone Texan on the 2004 postseason roster is freshman Brad Furnish (Lucas, Texas). The hard-throwing lefty is 3-0 with a 3.74 ERA, as he is holding opponents to a .221 average.

- Third baseman Alex Gordon is the lone Husker to start all 56 games this season, and has been in the starting lineup the past 77 contests, dating back to April 23, 2003. This season, Gordon has played in 493 of Nebraska's 497 innings, sitting out the final two innings of NU's wins over Kent State (Feb. 22) and Boston College (March 21).

- Nebraska puts its unblemished record of playing on Wednesdays on the line against the Longhorns in the Big 12 Tourney opener. The Huskers are 5-0 on Wednesdays, while UT is 1-0 in their only Wednesday game of the season.

- Few people enjoy playing at Omaha's Rosenblatt Stadium as much as Husker junior outfielder Daniel Bruce. The Millard West product is hitting a robust .464 (13-for-28) with six RBIs in six career games at Rosenblatt. Bruce went 2-for-5 with a double and triple in last Tuesday's win over Creighton.

- Nebraska's six shutouts are the most since the 2000 season when the Husker pitchers recorded nine shutouts. It also marks just the second time since 1991 that the Husker pitching staff has six or more shutouts in a year.

- Husker pitchers are issuing a league-low 2.77 walks per nine innings. NU is one of only three Big 12 teams who have walked less than three hitters per nine innings (Missouri, 2.87; Texas, 2.99)

- The May 16 loss at Baylor marked the first time that Nebraska had been swept in league play since the 2000 season. Since then, Nebraska has 13 three-game sweeps in league play, covering nine different league opponents. NU swept Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Kansas State and Texas A&M twice while taking brooms once to Kansas, Missouri, Iowa State, Texas Tech and Baylor. In fact, the only Big 12 team NU didn't sweep in that stretch was Texas.

- Nebraska saw its streak of 49 consecutive errorless innings come to an end at Creighton on May 18, as the Huskers committed their first error since May 10. The Jake Mullinax error in the first inning also snapped a streak of nine straight games without an error by the Husker infield dating back to May 2.

NU has now gone at least 45 innings without an error this season three times, including a stretch of 63.1 straight innings - the longest in over 20 years. NU is 10-6 when its does not commit a miscue. Tuesday's four-error game was one off a season high set on April 17 at Missouri. Nebraska's .775 fielding percentage is on pace to break the school mark (.771 in 1994 and 1995)

## Error Free Zone (45+ innings without an error)

- Alex Gordon looks to extend Nebraska's streak of Big 12 home run champions, as he is second in the league with 17 round trippers, one behind Travis Metcalf of Kansas - which ended its season on Sunday - and Josh Brady of Texas Tech for the league lead. A Husker has led the Big 12 in homers in each of the past four seasons, dating back to the 2000 season (Matt Hopper and Dan Johnson, 2000; Dan Johnson, 2001; Jed Morris, 2002; Matt Hopper, 2003).

While Gordon adds his legacy to an impressive list of Husker sluggers, he also looks to become the first Husker third baseman to earn first-team all-conference accolades since Derek Dukart in 1994. Gordon's performance not only potentially puts him among the favorites for league honors, but also compares very favorably to NU's last two Big 12 Players of the Year (Jed Morris in 2002 and Matt

Hopper in 2003). In addition, Ken Harvey's numbers from the 1999 season when he was Smith Award and Golden Spikes finalist are included below.

# Husker Baseball Notes (Big 12 Tournament)

## Gordon Invited to USA National Team Trials

Nebraska third baseman Alex Gordon was one of 19 players invited by USA Baseball to participate in the USA National Team Trials June 20-26 in Durham, N.C. Gordon was one of three Big 12 players invited, joining the Texas duo of J. Brent Cox and Taylor Teagarden. An additional 17 players will be invited later in the spring for the 20-man final roster. Gordon is bidding to become Nebraska's first Team USA player since Paul Meyers was selected in 1985.

## Bruce Named Academic All-District VII

Junior outfielder Daniel Bruce was honored last Thursday as he was a first-team CoSIDA Academic All-District VII selection. The Omaha, Neb., native is hitting .249 in 49 games with seven homers and 30 RBIs. In the classroom, he carries a 3.872 GPA in English and is bidding to become a two-time Academic All-Big 12 selection. Bruce is now eligible for CoSIDA Academic All-America honors and looks to become NU's ninth baseball Academic All-America since 1998.

## Gordon Honored Twice

Gordon was named to Baseball America's mid-season All-America team in early April. The Lincoln native was one of 17 sophomores chosen for the team, which includes one starter at each position, one utility player and six pitchers (five starters and a reliever). Baseball America lists a team for each of the four classes.

He was also honored as one of 30 players selected to the Golden Spikes Watch List. The Golden Spikes Award has been presented annually by USA Baseball since 1978 to the player who exhibits exceptional athletic ability and exemplary sportsmanship. Gordon is one of four Big 12 players on the 30-player watch list, joining Texas' pitching duo of J.P. Howell and Huston Street and Oklahoma State catcher Jason Jaramillo. Last week, he joined another exclusive list, as one of 30 semifinalists for the Dick Howser Award for the nation's top player.

## Grose Named to Johnny Bench Watch List

John Grose has been named to the Johnny Bench Watch List. The senior from Henderson, Nev., is a three-year starter for the Huskers and a career .290 hitter. Grose has thrown out 37 percent of

would-be base stealers this spring, as Nebraska has allowed a league-low 32 stolen bases. He is one of 45 candidates on the initial Watch List, but did not make the semifinal list announced last week.

## Second (Base) to None

With the graduation of Big 12 Player of the Year Matt Hopper, one of the questions entering 2004 was who would supply some of Hopper's home run power. Second baseman Jake Mullinax has become one of NU's long ball hitters in 2004. The senior co-captain from Hesperia, Calif., is second on the team with eight homers - including five in conference play. Mullinax, who also ranks among the Big 12 leaders with a .324 average and 12 sacrifices, was tied for second on the team with 20 RBIs in league games.

## Getting Defensive

Several defenders have played a key role in the Huskers ranking in the top five nationally in defense (according to the May 17th rankings). First baseman Curtis Ledbetter has made just one error in 446 chances for a .998 fielding percentage, a mark better than All-American Ken Harvey's .996 mark in 1999 - the year he was named Easton/Redline National Defensive Player of the Year.

Up the middle, NU's double play combination of Jake Mullinax and Joe Simokaitis have combined for 16 errors in 469 chances (.965 pct.). In addition, center fielder Colin Shockey has not committed an error in 135 chances this season.

## Pitchers Set Big 12 Shutout Streak Mark

In early April, the Nebraska pitching staff established a record with 43.1 scoreless innings. The record, which included 42 complete innings and parts of two others, broke the Big 12 record of 41 set by Texas in 2002. In all, the Husker pitchers tossed a pair of one-hitters, a three-hitter and a five-hitter before Kansas State scored a run in the fourth inning of NU's win on April 4, marking the first run scored by a Husker opponent since March 28. The four consecutive shutouts equaled a mark set over a four-game stretch over parts of the 1977 and 1978 seasons. Oklahoma held the Big Eight record with 31 straight scoreless innings in 1971, while Arizona State holds the NCAA mark with 64 straight scoreless innings back in 1972.

## Ouch!

Husker hitters have been hit at an alarming rate in 2004, getting plunked an amazing 93 times. In all, Nebraska has been hit by three or more pitches 19 times, including a season-high six against UW-Milwaukee on March 30. Colin Shockey leads the Huskers with 16 HBPs, while Daniel Bruce has been hit 14 times, increasing his school record to 56 in 174 career games. Nebraska needs to get hit 10 more times to match the school record set in 2003.

## Stingy Becker Cuts Out Inheritance

Left-hander Jeremy Becker has made a name for himself as one of the Big 12's best situational relievers. While he does not have a save, the 5-11, 215-pounder from Scottsbluff has played a major role in NU's success. He has allowed just three of 23 inherited runners to score in 2004. The academic All-America candidate went nearly an entire year (25 runners over his last 21 appearances) without allowing an inherited runner to score from April 25, 2003 to April 17, 2004.

While Becker's numbers are quite impressive, he is one of several relievers who have made it difficult on opponents. Brett Jensen has allowed just four of 21 inherited runners to score, and had a streak of 15 consecutive appearances without allowing an inherited runner to score snapped on Friday.

Other Huskers who excel in that role include right-handers Tim Schoeninger (5-of-18) and Dustin Timm (5-of-17), although Timm has been in the weekend rotation for the past month.

## Simokaitis Shows Unexpected Power

While shortstop Joe Simokaitis is more noted for his defensive expertise, the St. Louis, Mo., native provided one of the biggest offensive highlights of the 2004 season on April 30, with his three-run homer off Texas A&M ace Jason Meyer. The homer, his first since April 17, 2003 and second in 524 career at-bats, broke a 1-all tie and gave NU a 4-1 win over the No. 10 Aggies. It also marked the first homer that Meyer allowed in 70.2 innings this season, as NU handed the Aggie lefty his first loss in nine decisions.

Simokaitis has produced three game-winner RBIs in the past month, a ninth-inning single to beat Northern Colorado, 4-3, on April 27, and an 11th inning single in a 1-0 win over No. 18 Oklahoma on Saturday in addition to his homer against the Aggies.

## Gordon Stacks Up at Third

One of the main reasons for the Huskers' offensive firepower has been the play of third baseman Alex Gordon. The sophomore has been a steady force in the middle of the Husker lineup, leading the Big Red in nearly every offensive category. Gordon, who was named to the Golden Spikes Watch List last month, also paces NU in multi-hit games (24) and multi-RBI efforts (19) and has been walked a team-high 42 times. ## Four Huskers Honored by Dallas Morning News

Four Huskers were honored by the Dallas Morning News on the publication's preseason All-Big 12 team. Junior Curtis Ledbetter (DH), Joe Simokaitis (SS) and Quinton Robertson (RHP) were chosen for the first team, while Jake Mullinax (2B) was the lone Husker chosen for the second team. Nebraska and Texas were the only schools to have more than two first-team selections.

## Bruce Voted Best Outfield Arm in Big 12

Junior outfielder Daniel Bruce was voted as having the best defensive arm in the Big 12 in a poll of conference coaches for Baseball America. The Omaha native had a team-high six outfield assists in 2003, and 11 outfield assists in his three seasons as a Husker. Bruce, who could see time in both center and right field, batted .311 with six homers and 33 RBIs as a sophomore.

## Huskers Honored for Academic Work

A total of 15 Husker baseball players were honored earlier this season with selection to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll. The baseball players were among 286 Husker student-athletes who were recognized for their success in the classroom.

## Huskers Success Not Limited to Diamond

Nebraska has not only enjoyed an unprecedented run of success on the playing field, but has also shined in the classroom as well.

- Nebraska has had five first-team CoSIDA Academic All-Americans since 1999, including Jeff Leise, who was the Academic All-American of the Year in both 2002 and 2003.

- Leise and Aaron Marsden were both chosen as first-team CoSIDA All-Americans in 2003. Nebraska was the only school with two first-teamers on the 11-member squad encompassing all of Division I baseball.

- Twenty of 39 players recorded grade-point averages of 3.0 or better during the 2003 season.

- Nebraska had a league-best six first-team academic All-Big 12 selections in 2003.

- The Huskers have been finalists for the Herman Award - representing the highest men's and women's team GPAs on campus - in two of the past three seasons.

- A trio of Huskers have been nominated for CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, as pitchers Mike Sillman (3.775 GPA in business administration) and Jeremy Becker (3.674 GPA in agricultural engineering) are joined by outfielder Daniel Bruce (3.872 GPA in English). This is the second time that Bruce has been nominated and the first for both Becker and Sillman.

- The Nebraska baseball team joined the men's basketball, track and cross country teams as the four finalists for the Herman Award. The honor is presented to the men's and women's teams with the highest GPA over the previous two semesters. It marked the second straight season that the Husker baseball team has been a finalist for the campus award (won by the cross country team).
